Notice of Closure

The Red Lion will be closing on 31st December 2019 and will cease trading as public house as of this date.

I have been landlady here for nearly seven years and throughout that time it has been a financial struggle to keep the Lion trading. The Lion is not financially viable in its current configuration and I have ceased trading to seek paid employment.

I have made my decision with regret and sadness. I would like to give special thanks to my small band of loyal customers who have kept me going as long as I have. I will miss you all.

Subject to planning permission it is possible that the Lion could re-open at some point in the future probably under new management.

One of the biggest ironies of my time in charge of the Red Lion was the counter-intuitive impact of designating the Red Lion as a community asset. Prior to this designation the number of people using the pub was higher as individuals bought into a "use it or lose it" view that the pub would only survive if sufficient people actively supported it.

Once designated a community asset the number of people using the Red Lion reduced, presumably because they assumed it was now safe and they didn't need to actively support it.

The designation as a community asset doesn't suspend the operation of normal economics. If an asset is to be retained in the long term it has to be used by a sufficient percentage of the local community.

Baydon likes the idea of having a local pub but too few of the community actually want to use it themselves for it to be economically viable.
