An Interview with Caroline Knighton, Head of Baydon St Nicholas

Caroline took over as the Head of Baydon St Nicholas at the start of the academic year. I thought it would be good for the Scene to catch-up with her, know a bit more about her, her plans for the school and some of her favourite things:

How long have you been a teacher?

I qualified as a teacher in July 2005. Prior to this, I worked in the commercial and voluntary sectors for 10 years having initially qualified as a solicitor in 1993.

Why do you like being a teacher?

Because I believe that teachers can make a difference to young people's lives.

How has teaching changed since you started teaching?

There have been so many changes to teaching even since I qualified (a new National Curriculum, the introduction of the academies programme, a new assessment system to name but three) but the heart of the profession has not changed. Teachers and teaching assistants come in to the profession to make a difference and this is true of all the staff at Baydon school.

What is the best thing about teaching?

Watching children grow and develop. It's also great fun particularly when working with calleagues and parents who have the same aspiration:

What is the hardest thing about teaching?

Always wanting to do the best for the children in front of you – if you're not careful, you go home each day worried that you haven't done as much as you could have.

If you could ask the government to change one thing about primary education what would it be? To promote the profession and celebrate the wonderful work which teachers do across the UK each and every day.

What attracted you to Baydon St Nicholas?

Great children and a staff team who want to continue to provide the best for the children in their care.

What would you like to improve at the school?

There are so many great things about our school but schools always need to grow and develop. Our focus over the next few years will be on continuing to develop the high quality education which the children receive whilst maintaining the family relationships and Christian ethos which runs through all that we do

What is the best thing about the children at Baydon St Nicholas?

The children at Baydon are a true highlight of the school. Last week, the man who was testing our electrical appliances told us that he has never been in to a school where the children were as polite and friendly as they are at Baydon - how right he was.

What was your favourite subject at school?

I was lucky enough to enjoy most subjects and had a wonderful education but the subject which has probably lasted longest with me is English as evidenced by the fact that I constantly have my head in a book.

What is your favourite colour and why? Green as I love being outside.

What is your favourite food? Anything from Italy ...

What is your favourite pop band/pop star?

I don't really have an 'all time' favourite. I listen to a range of music from Mazart to Bob Marley. However, at the moment, what I really love listening to are the songs which my children download from Spotify as we're washing up after suppe - it keeps me young and in touch and is a highlight of the day!

BAYDON TABLE TENNIS CLUB

Baydon's newest club has now been running for just over two months and it has turned out to be a very pleasing success story. We have attracted the attention of almost twenty residents of the village who have turned up on more than one occasion to play the game.

We mostly play doubles which has the added attraction of having to move out of your partner's way so that they can take their shot. Collisions are inevitable but then this is part of the attraction of what is a very sociable sport. Table tennis is a very easy sport to begin playing (although difficult to master) so it is not long before the novice can play at a satisfying level. This is particularly true when playing doubles where differences in playing skills are easily accommodated and both the experienced and inexperienced player can have very enjoyable games together. I think we all have noticed a significant improvement in our game since we started last January. The last game of the evening is always around the table game where, using one table, all players take part and must run in a clockwise direction taking a shot from alternate ends. Each player has three 'lives' which means that after making three foul shots they are eliminated. The speed of the game clearly increases as players are eliminated until eventually there is only one player left standing, (which invariably is one of the younger members of the group!)

After finishing at 9 pm many of us migrate to the Red Lion for a well earned bevy or two. It is particularly pleasing to know that the Club may be bringing a little extra trade to the pub.

So if you think you may be interested in playing table tennis why not drop down and give it a try? We meet every Friday evening between 7:00 and 9:00 pm in the BYPA Hall. Road Calming in Manor Lane - a letter from resident Tom McGowran

I have lived in Manor Lane for nearly forty years and in that time have experienced a growth both in the number of vehicles using the lane and the speed they are travelling at. I have noted that since the chicanes were installed on Ermin St. there has been an increase in the through traffic East to West. Many of these drivers are travelling at an inappropriate speed in the lane but not necessarily breaking the speed limit of 30mph. I have questioned some drivers as to why they were using the lane as a through route and they have replied that their GPS systems have guided them that way!

When travelling East on Ermin St towards the chicane one can observe that if traffic is halted to allow east bound traffic, the entrance to Manor Lane is welcoming and it is all too easy to turn left and use the lane as a shortcut to Aldbourne Road.

The Government published its national Strategic Framework for Road Safety (SFRS)12in May 2011. It places an expectation on local government to continue to prioritise road safety and seek improvements by adopting policies that reflect local priorities and circumstances. The SFRS emphasises the importance of local decision-making to reflect local road safety priorities. A key theme of the SFRS is to 'make it easier for road users to do the right thing'.

Fast and aggressive driving intimidates all road users, particularly pedestrians and cyclists. It deters people from these sustainable modes and may discourage parents from allowing their children to walk and cycle to school and for other journeys.

- Many suggestions have been put forward to calm traffic in the lane, these include; Make the lane one way. The problem with this is that traffic is likely to speed up knowing no one is coming in the opposite direction.
- Make the last 50 yards from Dark Lane to Ermin St one way. Effectively no entry from Ermin St. This would make the lane a no through route but would have the consequence of lorries visiting the sewage works would then have to use the Aldbourne Road entrance to the lane.
- No Entry signs for through traffic; These are used at the Foxhill crossroads on the way to Wanborough. Unless this type of signage is monitored no one takes any notice.
- Speed humps could be considered. These cause an increase in noise and pollution. Surveys have indicated that drivers speed up between humps.

More extreme measures include to apply for a licence to hold a street party for three hours every fortnight!

One can also apply to make the road a children's play area or quiet street. This allows one to close the road to through traffic and give children the right to play in the road. This does not affect residential use of the road. This is difficult to monitor.

One could also apply to close the road with a gate or barrier across the road, say between Waldrons Close and Dark Lane. Emergency appliances and service vehicles would have a key for access. This particular calming measure is one of the few measures available that does not have to be policed to be effective.

Manor lane currently meets the criteria for reducing the speed limit to 20mph. It has no pavements, narrow with poor street lighting, a youth club/playgroup village hall, many blind spots together with numerous driveways which necessitate cars reversing into the carriageway.

I am informed that the cost of reducing the speed limit would be in the region of £4,000. Whilst this speed limit cannot be monitored it would at least be a start in informing drivers that it is inappropriate to exceed this speed. Secondly I would recommend that the entrance from Ermin Street into Manor Lane be reduced or squared off to discourage through drivers from taking it as a shortcut.

Manor Lane is only one road in Baydon that needs traffic calming but it is perhaps one of the easiest to implement traffic calming upon. I would appreciate any views or comments you may have on the above.

La Nuit de Feu" ("Night of Fire") by Eric-Emmanuel Schm

I've read several of Eric-Emmanuel Schmitt's novels and short stories However, this book is an account of a real-life trek in the Algerian desert which the author undertook as part of filming a documentary on Charles de Foucauld, a European who, a century before, had gone to live among the nomadic peoples there.



In no other of Schmitt's books that I've read has he written so eloquently and with such careful choice of words as when he describes his "Night of Fire", as he becomes separated from his companions, lost in the desert as night falls and can see nothing at all except the stars. Faced with the prospect of

death, alone and cold, instead the former philosopher has a phenomenal spiritual encounter, a communicative interaction which fills him with intense joy and has a profound effect on him. took Schmitt 25 years to get around to writing this book; which I think speaks of the depth of the impression the experience left in him. He reflects on how we value one another, how we val just being alive, and what is that is important in life. Being a philosopher, he questions his experience as he lives it and afterwards, and concludes that there are three possible hone answers to the question of whether God exists: the believer, who says, "I don't know but believe so"; the atheist, who says, "I don't know but I believe not", and the agnostic, who says, ' don't know but it doesn't matter

Traffic Calming update for Ermin Street

Baydon Parish Council held an Extraordinary Meeting on Monday 20 March, essentially becau: Wiltshire Highways did not agree that the proposed western buildout should be dropped due to safety concerns. (They suggested safety could be improved by cutting the hedges.) Highways had also stated that they would be unsupportive of progressing just half the scheme i.e. a single eastern buildout, as previously proposed by BPC.

In addition, Highways had reiterated that there are no other possible locations for the western buildout and the 30mph limit cannot be moved further out of the village towards the cricket field. Other traffic calming measures such as platforms, cannot be installed until build-outs are in place. The £12k funding for the project was due to expire imminently, therefore, ClIrs needed to decide whether to:

a) Continue with the proposed western build-out, enabling the whole traffic calming project for Ermin St to go ahead

OR

b) Discontinue with traffic calming for Ermin St, because the current and only scheme available was unacceptable.

Clirs unanimously resolved to continue with the proposed scheme for two buildouts on Ermin St. Among many other considerations, Clirs noted that traffic calming was the top priority highlighted by residents in the Village Plan and there are no alternative traffic calming schemes available. Cllrs agreed to assist the immediate neighbours (if requested), to cut their hedge and install a mirror, consequently improving their sightlines near the western chicane.

Dates for the work to take place will be confirmed in due course.
