#### Clergy letter...

#### Simon writes..... **Easter Greetings**

The old adage is that 'Hope springs eternal in the young man's breast'. For many people, particularly after a long winter, it seems the other way around; it is Spring that brings Hope. Spring, with its



promise of new life and longer, lighter days seems a much more hopeful time of year.

In the Christian calendar we see something similar. The sombreness of Lent gives way to the hope of Easter. The bleakness of betrayal and the pain and abandonment of death on the Cross, point to the joy and promise of the Easter morning. The new life theme of Easter is mirrored in the old symbols of Easter eggs and Easter 'bunny'. The new life of Spring is echoed in the Easter promise of death defeated and of life everlasting.

This year I hope that each of us will be able to look beyond the outward symbols to the meaning of Easter. The promise of Easter is not of a new life without cost; a new life in the natural way of things. It is about a new life with God bought at a price; a price that we can never repay. A gift of new life which is priceless and yet freely given to those who place their trust in Jesus Christ.

As the church services take us from Palm Sunday through Good Friday to Easter Day itself, we find that Easter is an event, not a season. This is life in all its fullness; new life that starts at the point we turn to Christ and which continues for ever. It points to an unbroken continuity between physical life and life in the heavenly places. For the Christian this is truly a time of good news. Happy Easter.

## Church Roof - fund Raizing

The Baydon St. Nicholas church roof is badly leaking and needs urgent repair. We're fundraising to stop the leaks!

We have obtained all the necessary permission from the Diocese and local authorities that have been involved in the planning of the repairs to the church roof. The work would only take about three weeks to complete so it seems very disappointing that we have to spend so much time putting out the buckets and bowls to catch the rainwater every wet day. The condition of the roof is deteriorating so the repairs are urgent. We just need to press on even harder with our fund-raising.

The fund currently stands at £13,700. though the architects fees will come out of that. We need £20,000 before we can call the contractors.




#### Baydon Super School Science Sets Sail For A New Level

The company is called <u>'Beat a Quote'</u> and leaflets show the company address as PRAMA HOUSE, 267 BANBURY ROAD, OXFORD OX27HT telephone numbers 01865 339544 or mob 07748872864

The people who run this company are from Swindon and have both recently been **convicted of Rogue Trading Fraud** offences and imprisoned following a case led by Oxfordshire Trading Standards. #### "The Other Hand" by Chris Cleave

"The Other Hand" is a brave story. Despite the grimness of the situations it recounts, courage, hope, determination and loyalty are displayed both large and bold, and quietly. These stand out over fear and betrayal in other areas, sometimes from the same characters.



The writing and the story are, to my mind, hugely creative - I cannot imagine coming up with such a thorough and wide-ranging plot in my own head. The notes at the back show the research into real-life situations that

underpins the book, however. This may be fiction, but it could just happen out there in the big wide world. All the more affecting, then.

The cover of the book itself refuses to divulge any of the plot or the characters, just saying that the story is special and "extremely funny, but the African beach scene is horrific". Well, yes, steel yourself for that. The cover also says, "Once you have read it, you'll want to tell everyone about it. When you do, please don't tell them what happens either." Well, they're not wrong; so I won't give the plot away. I'll just say that it crosses continents and cultures; clashes Nigerian village life, international big business, bandits and London suburbia; it challenges loyalties, values and priorities; it could tug at your heart and yet still, amidst it all, make you laugh. The characters are solid, credible and three-dimensional, with admirable traits and frail weaknesses. And anyone with a young child obsessed with a particular story will recognise Batman.




Visitors can watch volunteers working on the Turkey Work chairs project, and see displays by some of the crafts people refurbishing the House.
