

#### Hello All



# **Church Letter**

Easter – eagerly looked forward to, and then seemingly gone in a flash!

So what's left afterwards – maybe just the remains of the chocolate glut? Or – if we've built up to it by trying to keep Lent in some meaningful sort of way – should there be something more?

After the first Easter, Jesus' disciples had to work out fresh ways of being his followers in a new sort of community. The amazing day when he rose from the dead had totally changed the way they thought about life and death. They were setting out on a journey into the unknown – spreading the Good News, building up the young church, and trying to live lives that were consistent with this new stage in their relationship with God.

We're on a similar journey – trying to find better ways of being integrated individuals within ourselves, of being community, of being disciples in the twenty-first century. So we can't just vegetate – we need to grow and develop, both individually and as a community. One way of doing that might be to come to the five sessions of basic Christian exploration and discussion being offered in April and May (see fuller details elsewhere in this issue). Alternatively, there might be books we might read or other things we could try – perhaps in company with others.

Wherever we are on the faith journey, there is always the possibility of fascinating discoveries just over the horizon – if we will only stir our stumps and go and look for them!

# **Thinking about Confirmation?**

It is some time since we invited a group to prepare for confirmation.

At the moment we are looking towards <u>Saturday 11<sup>th</sup> May at 6pm in Salisbury Cathedral.</u> If there are people in the churches who might want to explore what confirmation might mean, with the possibility of it taking place in May, we will gather a group together.

Confirmation is not simply about taking the bread and wine at Holy Communion; although that is a visible result. Confirmation is about taking a further step in our faith, about recognising God in our journey, about taking a more active part in the life of our local church. In other words, 'discipleship' – learning more about our faith and what it means to follow the way of Christ.

It doesn't matter whether we are a teenager or an older person, it is never too early or late to find out more and to be confirmed.

The Wiltshire Medical service will no longer be answering out of hours calls - call are diverted to the 111 service. The Surgery are keen to learn of your experiences using this new service.

A **Self Service Blood Pressure check** is now available in the waiting room at the Ramsbury Surgery. No appointment is necessary. After taking your blood pressure the machine will print your result and you are then requested to write your full name address and date of



birth on the back of the print out and hand it in to reception. If your result needs a follow up a member of the clinical team will contact you.

# Messages from Chair - Andy Knowles

Welcome to this edition of Council's Corner and by the time it goes to print I'm sure it would have stopped snowing!!

A few things to update everyone on from the past few months; firstly, on behalf of everyone in the village we would like to extend a warm welcome to Mark and Julie. As we all know this has been a hot topic recently, so please help the village retain the **pub** and support it once it re-opens in June.



You're Precept on your council tax bill: for those that attend the meetings will have witnessed the Parish Council approve the precept, however I thought I would briefly explain the increase. Like for like comparison actually saw the precept decrease but it was necessary to include this year a sum of money to contribute towards the expected traffic calming measures and it was this amount only that created the increase percentage year on year.

**Allotments:** a brief reminder to let people know that if you have or wish to occupy a full or half allotment patch then you must apply in writing to the Parish Clerk, if you require to change patches or resign your rented patch at the allotment then the same process needs to be followed.

We are currently undertaking an application to complete the works carried out on the **playground** by including additional equipment inline with the original proposal. We are hoping to include either a roundabout or traditional swing, maybe both at some point in the new financial year.

As always I would like to extend my thanks to everyone on the council for the hard work and dedication they put in to serve the village in the best possible way. If you would like to be involved then please do so in writing to the Parish Clerk.



In a NON EMERGENCY dial 101 if:

- you want to report a crime/issue that does not require an immediate emergency response
- you or someone else are not in immediate danger
- you would like to speak to your local police officer
- you want to provide information about a crime

# If you need medical NHS help fast, but it is not life threatening – call 1 1 1

# What is OOO?

If you need medical help fast but it's not a life-threatening situation, you can now call the new NHS 111 number. When you call 111, a trained adviser will ask you questions to find out what's wrong, give you medical advice and direct you to someone who can help you, like an out-of-hour doctor or a community nurse.

If the adviser thinks your condition is more serious, they will direct you to hospital or send an ambulance. If you don't speak English, tell the adviser what language you want to speak and they will get you an interpreter. You can call 111 any time of the day. The call is free, from landlines and mobiles:

# When do I use it?

You should only call 999 in an emergency – for example, when someone's life is at risk or someone is seriously injured or critically ill.

Call 111 if you need medical help fast, but it's not life-threatening – for example, if you

- · think you need to go to hospital
- · don't know who to call for medical help
- . don't have a GP to call
- . need medical advice or reassurance about what to do next

For health needs that are not urgent, you should call your GP.

If a health professional has given you a number to call for a particular condition, you should continue to use that number.

# Who can use it?

The NHS 111 number is currently only available in certain areas of England.

If you're outside of these areas, you should call NHS Direct on 0845 4847.



# **Roque traders**

It's that time of year when opportunists start to call seeing if there are jobs to be done on your house or garden, or to sell you something.

People who call at your home may well be genuine.

But it is a good idea to take precautions when answering the door to people you don't know.

Doorstep traders are not always genuine or honest salespeople. Rogue traders may try to push you into agreeing to unnecessary home repairs or improvements, often at extortionate prices.

It can feel impossible to get rid of doorstep traders unless you agree to sign up for whatever they are selling. But it's your doorstep and you are in control. **Don't be afraid to say no. Don't agree to anything, sign a contract or pay money until you have talked to someone else**, and **never** let anyone persuade you to go to your bank and withdraw cash for a payment.

Above all, don't be afraid to ask a salesperson to leave. You don't need to feel embarrassed about refusing to let someone in. Only let someone in when you are absolutely sure they are genuine.

You can always ask the caller to come back another time when someone will be with you, or tell them to write to you to arrange a more convenient time to visit. It is particularly important to do this if there is more than one person on your doorstep. A genuine caller won't mind you taking these precautions.

Remember: if in doubt, keep them out.

If you are still suspicious, dial 999 and ask for the police.
