

### Away Break with a Purpose

In January's Week of Prayer for Christian Unity I went with the group of six people from Salisbury Diocese to the market town of Bernay in our twinned Diocese of Evreux in Normandy.

The link between the two churches is now twenty five years old and I found it very warm and vibrant. During the visit old friendships were renewed and new ones made. We were made very welcome and shared in services both in the parish church and in the near-by Abbey of le Bec Hellouin, which has a special place in the relationship between the Church of England and the Catholic Church in France.

As well as meeting people, we learnt a lot about how their parish with its eighteen churches works. We saw something of the ministries offered by lay people in so many ways and about their commitment to the service of people in need.

I look forward to offering a similar experience when a group from the Whitton Benefice goes over to spend the weekend in June 11<sup>th</sup> – 14<sup>th</sup> in the parish of Notre Dame des Bois near Louviers. We welcomed four people from there at the September celebrations of the 1100<sup>th</sup> anniversary of the first Bishop of Ramsbury.

Huge thanks to Vodafone employees (via Tamsin Witt - our esteemed Councillor) who match funded over £1K for the school! Brilliant







The members enjoyed entertainment ably provided by the "Songmen", a group of 14 men from local villages who excelled in the a-cappella style of singing.


In the absence of any other candidates Mrs Penny Stephens was re-elected as president until December 10.

## Newsletter

**Welcome** to the March edition of the Neighbourhood policing team bulletin.

Anti-social behaviour patrols are still being carried out by myself and my colleagues. There have been no reported incidents throughout the month of February. Lets hope that this can continue.

### Message from the NPT Sergeant Ben Braine:

A brief update for you re: the series of rural crime, burglaries, thefts of motor vehicles and agricultural machinery, and thefts of heating oil in the area.

Inspector Noble, myself, and our Community Beat Managers are committed to providing high visibility patrols at peak offence times in our areas. We have been running this targeted patrol scheme for several weeks now.

We have noted a sharp decrease in the overall number of offences being reported and believe this to be directly attributable to our increased presence in rural areas, and our tactics of proactively searching for and stopping all load carrying vehicles travelling through our areas.

Our intention at the outset was to prevent and detect crime, and to interfere with the movements of travelling criminals, hopefully gaining valuable intelligence in the process.


Whilst assuring you of the continued presence of Police patrols in your community areas it may be that you have noticed a slight reduction in the visibility of your Community Beat Manager. This will be solely due to their efforts directed towards combating rural crime during the early hours of the morning. rollers rotated by a projecting handle attached to a huge wheel; whilst, hanging from a large peg on the wall, was a zinc bath, though it must be said that complete bathing was difficult and often shared by as many as four children at a time.

Upstairs, few cottages had more than two bedrooms and these often led one to the other. Brass or iron framed bedsteads were used with mattresses filled by the housewife with feathers or oat-chaff.

Much is said today about housing shortages and poor living conditions and this, of course, is right and proper. However, the plain fact remains that around 1900 AD four Baydon families lived for some considerable time in a rectangular building called Upper Barn, adjacent to the Village Green. The four allotted living spaces were separated by three large wagon sheets suspended from the roof, and as may be imagined, only the crudest services were available. Ultimately a Mr Bracey built some cottages nearby to accommodate these very ill-housed people.

By contrast, during the decade 1960-69 the number of Baydon deaths recorded was 23. Not one of these was under twenty years of age, and 15 (65%) were over the age of seventy: the average age of death was seventy-two.

Various factors account for this progress towards healthy living: but undoubtedly the crowded conditions, meagre and ill-conditioned water supplies and crude sanitation of those early days added to the anxieties of the harassed housewives.

Each cottage had an earth closet sited in a hut at the bottom of the garden. But, apparently, pride of place existed even here. One informant remembers how a certain family boasted of their triple-seated affair, fitted with holes of various sizes to accommodate different ages. The effluent of these places was emptied periodically and spread over gardens to speed the growth of next year's 'greens.'

The Village School and some houses had on-site drainage pipes leading to cesspits, but such pipes often became blocked from lack of flushing and over-full pits. As late as 1916 the School Managers applied to the LEA for, 'a tin of disinfectant to mitigate the risk of infection.'

The small scullery leading from the living-room to the back door of cottages stored wood, coal and various implements for carrying out the many chores of house and garden.

In the corner was a massive stone-built copper, consisting of a large zinc or iron bowl sunk into the upper part; a fireplace set into the stonework below served as an all purpose boiler for washing, baths, Christmas puddings and the like.

Inevitably there was a mangle, a monstrosity looking machine equipped with large wooden



Ornate biscuit tins and tea caddies were also around and bric-a-brac from the stalls of local fairs. Stone flags provided most of the ground flooring, the cold surface alleviated by odd pieces of matting or sacking.

These cottages were draughty as well as ill-lit, the only heat coming from the living room fire, which served for cooking as well. Often a metal bar traversed the wide chimney-piece on which could be hung a large iron kettle and a stew pot, which was seldom empty. Smaller utensils stood on the hob or on a trivet attached to the bars of the grate. A pair of bellows to invigorate a lazy fire hung by the

hearth in every home. Various other pots and pans reposed on shelves or hung from books around the place and these, and other impediments and clothing, pretty well cluttered up the remaining available space.

It is indeed difficult to envisage how some families, with maybe four, five, or even six children, managed to live under the restrictive and crude conditions of their cottage homes. Yet it appears that they existed tolerably well. It is interesting to note that in 1901, following a request by the Wiltshire Education Authority to consider the advisability of setting up a Children's Advisory Committee, the Managers of the Baydon School unanimously agreed, 'that such a Committee was wholly unnecessary for Baydon, as the children were well-looked-after by their parents.'

But, health-wise, many were neither as robust nor healthy as youngsters today. Outbreaks of measles, diphtheria, smallpox, scarlet fever, ringworm and other ills took their toll and depleted many homes. In the first decade of this century (1900-1909) the number of deaths recorded in the village totalled 50. Of these 13 (26%) were young persons under the age of twenty, and 17 (34%) were over the age of seventy; the average age of death was forty-eight.



# Focus On...

*Where we focus on something of interest, someone or a group of folk in the village*

By popular demand, we're repeating the History of Baydon by Jack Naish which was serialised in Scene many moons ago. With oodles of thanks to Mo Lafford for collecting all of the editions together again.

## Jack Naish : 1902 - 1995.

Jack and his wife Mary lived in Aldbourne Road, Baydon, for more than thirty years. A very respected and much loved 'gentle' gentleman, he had a wide knowledge of local people and village life, and was always ready to help anyone in need of assistance.

## **BAYDON CIRCA 1900 - A SERIAL HISTORY by the late R J NAISH JP Episode 2 - Dwellings and Health**

At this time most of the dwellings in Baydon were of the small cottage type; only the Manor, the Vicarage and several farmsteads were of any size. The cottages were built mainly in sarsens, flints and chalkstone, and the roofs were mostly thatched. Walls were thick and windows small and narrow, passageways were shrouded in sepulchral gloom. Outside doors were of rough wood, fronted by irregular stone steps and paths. Two rooms up the narrow rickety stairway and two down were mainly the order of the day; a shed-type scullery was invariably added to the ground floor.

Furnishings were simple and sparse. Two wooden armchairs with padded seats - one on each side of the living room stove or range - presented the height of luxury. A table, an odd wooden chair or stool or two and, maybe a dresser or wooden settle, were the other main items available.

Mantel shelves and walls were cluttered with the assortment of knick-knacks that Victorians loved so well. Pride of place went to the odd family photograph - by now an innovation for the humblest household - and to small pieces of china of diverse shapes, displaying coats-of-arms, mainly of sea-side towns, mementoes of day trips taken over the years.

## *Bus to Newbury*

*Did you know that there is a bus that runs from Baydon to Newbury every Thursday for Market Day?*

The bus is actually subsidised by West Berkshire County Council and will visit the "Sheffords" on route if requested. It also travels into Hungerford. It is unclear as to why it also comes to Baydon, but a simple phone call to **01635 582929** (new contact number) will ensure you a seat.

It leaves Baydon (end of Downsmead) at 10.20am (new time) and leaves Newbury at 1.40pm for the return journey.

It may not be as quick, or follow such a direct route, as in the car but it certainly beats finding a place to park - and of course it is free for those over sixty (providing you have your bus pass).

# **Bike Rides from Baydon**

## Ride 04

Wellbottom Down Gallops

Distance: 18Km

Time: 1½ hrs

- ⌘ Start as usual from the green at Baydon.
- ⌘ Head out on the Russley road, taking the first right turn after the motorway bridge towards Baydon Hole Farm.
- ⌘ Follow this track past Baydon Hole, along the track and up the short hill.
- ⌘ At the track crossroads at the top of the hill, carry straight over. This will bring you down onto the B4000 Ashbury road.
- ⌘ Take a left onto the B4000 and after about 400m take the turning to your right.
- ⌘ Follow this road, which turns into a track, up the hill for about 1.5km until you reach another track crossroads (called Hangman's Stone). Again here head straight across.
- ⌘ After about 1km you're looking to take a bridleway on you left. This actually takes you onto the gallops
- ⌘ The bridleway runs for about 3km along side the gallops. This is the area called "Wellbottom Down".
- ⌘ At the end of the gallops, the bridleway splits into two. There is a bridleway running downhill to you left; take this one.
- ⌘ We're now effectively going to take the Uffingham Castle Loop (ride 2) outward leg back to Baydon.
- ⌘ At the bottom of the hill, follow the bridleway around the trees and keep going straight towards Weathercock Hill.
- ⌘ Head up the short, steep hill where the flagpole is at the top and back down the other side. This is a great downhill, but don't forget you'll come to the B4000 at bottom, so brake early!
- ⌘ At the B4000, cross straight over and head for Bailey Hill.
- ⌘ Climb Bailey Hill, knowing you're almost home, one last flat out downhill and eventually join the Russley road.
- ⌘ Turn right back over the motorway bridge and back to Baydon.



## And now for something really scrumptious

Penelope Stephens from the fantastic Baydon WI has kindly proffered this yummy Easter recipe (which seems very easy and Easterly and probably contributes at least two to your five a day!) It's for:

### Easter Biscuits (yield 15-20 biccies)

#### You'll need:

- \* 3oz butter or marg
- \* 2½oz sugar
- \* 1 egg - separated
- \* 6oz SR flour
- \* 1½oz currants
- \* ½oz mixed peel
- \* 1-2 tbspn milk
- \* ½ tspn salt



2 greased baking trays

#### Method

1. Cream butter and sugar
2. Beat in egg yolk
3. Sift flour and fold into creamed mixture
4. Add currants and mixed peel
5. Add enough milk to give soften dough
6. Cover and leave in cool place until firm
7. Knead lightly on a floured board and roll out to ¼" thick
8. Cut into rounds 2 ½" diameter
9. Bake at 400 F - 200 C -Mark 6 (fairly hot) for 10 mins.
10. Brush with egg white and sprinkle with sugar and bake for a further 10 mins until lightly coloured
11. Cool
