

From May 1<sup>st</sup> 2016 the pattern of services in the Whitton Team churches will be changing. A detailed explanation has been circulated, together with the pattern for all the churches, but the major change will be that Team Services will be monthly on the first Sunday in each month at 10 am, rather than guarterly as at present, moving round the various churches in turn.

- 4<sup>th</sup> Sunday 9.30am Holy Communion (Modern Language) with hymns
- 5<sup>th</sup> Sunday 9.30am Morning Prayer (Modern Language) with hymns on alternate 5<sup>th</sup> Sundays (see noticeboard)

#### From the Minister...

By the time you read this, Easter will already have come and gone – it was very early this year. The date fluctuates because of the difficulty of reconciling our solar calendar of 365¼ days with the Jewish lunar calendar,



based on a 28-day "moon month". And you don't have to be an arithmetical genius to work out that the one doesn't divide neatly into the other, so inevitably they get out of sync!

There's been some discussion lately – yet again – about the desirability of setting a fixed date for Easter, to make life simpler for schools and travel firms and all sorts of other people, and it would certainly be a lot "tidier". It would also, however, lose the ancient theological link between the Resurrection of Jesus at Easter and the Jewish celebration, linked to the Spring equinox, of the Passover – the escape of the Jews from slavery in Egypt more than 3000 years ago.

Whatever the rights and wrongs of the suggested change, they shouldn't divert us from the importance of both festivals as infinitely more than just an excuse for a holiday – they both celebrate new life and new beginnings. Easter, in particular, brings the joyful message that death isn't all there is, that there is always hope, and that the weakness of vulnerable, sacrificial, love is stronger than all the power of evil.

In the weeks following the first Easter, Jesus' followers had to work out how to live in the light of the liberating news of the Easter message. We too need to consider how the Easter promise of life and forgiveness might – and should – affect the way we live our own lives, today, in this lovely corner of Wiltshire. The message of Easter goes on all year, long after the last little bit of chocolate's been eaten!

#### Baydon owes a debt of gratitude to Enid Johnso


In March, Baydon saw one of its long-term residents move to pastures new to be nearer her family.

Enid Johnson was born in Lancashire and moved to Baydon with her husband and family in 1964 when David Johnson took up a lecturing post at Swindon Technical College. Her youngest daughter Fiona was born shortly afterwar

During her 52 years in Baydon, Enid has done countless things for the village and the church.

One of Enid's first roles in the village was as the Clerk to the Parish Council. A position she held from 1966 for 8 years £15 per year! Enid was Clerk whilst the M4 was being built. She was eventually Chair of the Parish Council. In the 60's Enid was also president of the WI for 2 years.

Enid had many years of involvement with Baydon St Nicholas School, firstly as a governor and then as the Chairman of the Board of Governors.



Enid has for a long-time been a collector of donations in the village for Christian - aid. Delivering envelopes through villager's doors and collecting the donations ma

From 1970, until her departure from Baydon, Enid has been a trustee and administration of the Sylvia Mather Trust. The trust gives small bursary's to village children who go to University, to enable them to purchase text books or equipment for their studies

Enid very much cared about the community of Baydon and its future. She managed many of these tasks whilst also being a supportive wife & mother and carrying ou responsible full time jo

A lunch was held in the school on 13<sup>th</sup> March for villagers to say goodbye and to express their gratitude for all she has do

Enid will be missed in the village and in Church and we wish her well for the future.

#### **Remembering Timothy Fitzgerald**

'a man you don't meet everyday'

Villager Tim Fitzgerald sadly passed away earlier this year.

Tim was born in Ireland, where he grew up with his 13 brothers and sisters. He came to England when he was 19 years old with his beloved sister Lizzie. Tim moved to Baydon circa 1957, where he met his wife, Kathleen, at a youth club dance when the BYPA hall was a tin hut. They got married at the Sacred Heart Catholic Church in Lambourn but had their reception in the BYPA Hut.

For many years Tim worked in the village for well-renowned race-horse trainers Rosie and David Lomax. Tim was a great horseman and David Lomax remembered Tim's skills in an email to Tim's daughter Marilyn after his death in January:

He listened to the horses so they listened to him. He won the horse's trust from there. He was once asked to accompany a particularly nervous horse to Germa the hold of an aeroplane and he readily agreed. It would be no bother. He didn't get to go in the end as he didn't have a passport, never having seen the point of going anywhere other than Ireland or Baydon!

Tim was well known in Baydon for his pony and cart, with which he gave pony rides at **the school fete until he died**. When a chi turn was over and they didn't want to get off the pony he didn't have the heart to tell them, so he said ok one more go round, such was his kindness and love for children. Tim also always 'appeared' at the Aldbourne carnival in some shape or form until a f years ago.



Tim had a great sense of humour and loved a joke. He was kind hearted and selfless. He was devoted to his children and grandchildren, although described as the "Naughty Grandad"!

Tim's funeral was held in Baydon on 21st January and the Church was filled to capacity, with mourners spilling out of the door.

Tim will be remembered fondly by villagers and is sadly missed in the Red Lion.



Here are words from Wiltshire Council's web-site:


"Dog owners must, by law, pick up any mess made by their pets in public places such as roads, footpaths, school playing fields, sports fields and parks.

Go Set a Watchman – Harper Lee

Harper Lee's Pulitzer prize-winning To Kill a Mockingbird has deservedly become a classic text. White widowed lawyer Atticus Finch, bringing up two children, Jem and young tomboy Scout, with the help of housekeeper Calpurnia, defends a negro on a rape



charge in the Deep South of the United States of America in a time of segregation by colour. The sequel, Go Set a Watchman, is set some 20 years later as the civil rights movement is underway. Jem has died young of the same condition that claimed his mother, and Scout, now known by her given name of Jean Louise, is studying in cosmopolitan New York, where attitudes to race, education, ability and opportunity are a long way from those of her conservative hometown, Maycomb. Her "colour-blindness" ("I thought we were all just people") is challenged as the attitudes of both white and black residents to political and social change come to the surface. Jean Louise must see that the challenges of transition are complex, and the route to the destination is not necessarily straight or smooth. Most devastatingly, the people she loves and respects the most, including her father, seem to have taken positions she cannot possibly hold with but cannot flee from. The tin gods must topple, however heart-rending this is, for Jean Louise to become an independent adult making a worthy contribution to a society in need of such as her. Along the way, we learn more of the childhood and adolescence that formed Scout Finch.

Tamzin grew up in Baydon and comes back from time to time to visit her Dad. After some gadding about, she currently lives in the beautiful north east of England, working for a start-up exploiting a new X-ray imaging technique.
