

Baydon Teens in Danger

Please be aware that canisters of nitrous oxide and balloons have been found in the cricket field in Baydon. It appears that the craze which was thought to be isolated to Marlborough town has spread further afield

The accompanying extract from the Gazette and Herald (see link below) describes the situation in Marlborough and the serious consequences are defined both in terms of health and court attendance for those apprehended.

If any parents have any information or concerns about the use of nitrous oxide in Baydon ie names of those involved, whereabouts of evidence etc they should contact the police immediately.

Side effects to watch out for are dizziness, slurred speech and fits of the giggles.

New Plastic bottle & cardboard recycling service

As you may have seen in the Coming Soon leaflet that dropped through your door in July, Wiltshire Council is introducing a new plastic bottle & cardboard recycling collection service across the county from autumn.

The new plastic bottle & cardboard recycling collection service will start at the beginning of November 2011, with new blue-lidded bins being delivered to households throughout October.

Residents will receive a leaflet & collection calendar information through the post shortly before the bins are delivered, explaining how to use the service and when to put the blue lidded bin out for collection.

Slightly different arrangements have been made for residents who live in flats, and an assessment will be carried out on each individual block of flats to determine exact bin requirements. This is explained in more detail in the information being delivered through the post before the bins arrive.

This month, Tamzin Lafford has reviewed some summer reading for us:

Book Review: "The Lost Continent", by Bill Bryson.

Who else gets to earn a living selling worldwide their accounts of What I Did On My Holidays?!

I bought this book in a second-hand bookshop-cumcafe - undoubtedly a dangerous place for my purse to be. I bought it because I've found others of Bryson's books quite interesting and informative, with a touch of his particular humour. Indeed, I don't think I'd have taken a 36 hours train trip across an Australian desert, had I not read Mr. Bryson's account in "Down Under".



Bryson took himself on two whistle-stop road trips across 38 of the American states, resulting in this very personal and subjective account, at times cheerful or moody, humourous, dismayed, awed or occasionally somewhat adolescent (for example, the description of going drinking with his brother). "The Lost Continent" contains a few eloquent, even inspiring descriptions of landscapes, towns and sights of interest, with praise for interesting and creative presentations, which recommends them to further investigation; amid other more mundane accounts. There is a gratifying horror of tat trinkets sold to tourists, and sometimes overvalued entry prices to some disappointing attractions (at least he is not writing just to please sponsors). I'm sure that not everywhere received a fair review, but then this never set out to be an impartial review of all there is to see in the US - it is no Lonely Planet Rough Guide. It is an easy read, Bryson's personal opinions, and not his best work, but there are some small gems to be gleaned. Some readers will be inspired to travel to see for themselves the breathtaking scenery; or maybe to plan their own voyage in the opposite direction! Some, no doubt, will be just as glad to stay at home.

Tamzin grew up in Baydon, attending St. Nicholas' School. Reading has been a significant pastime since childhood. Having spent years writing scientific reports in bullet-points, she ventured into more creative writing on her blog when she went travelling in 2009. Currently living and working in France, the blog has gone bilingual, although Tamzin does not vouch for the accuracy of the French.

Where we focus on something of interest, someone or a group of folk in the village

Gardening over the coming months

This is one of the busier times of the gardening year, especially if you're growing your own fruit and veg – hopefully you'll be harvesting bumper crops.

Top jobs for the next few months are:

- Keep on dead-heading flowering plants.
- As you harvest veg crops and empty beds, dig in any well-rotted manure or compost that you have to hand to feed the soil.
- Lawns may show signs of heat-drought now and brown patches are not uncommon. One good way to prevent this is by mowing frequently yet lightly (on quite a high setting). This allows you to leave the lawn clippings where they fall thus creating a protective water-retaining mulch to protect the grass.
- Give your hedges a final trim, ready for autumn/winter.
- Prune rambling roses once they've finished flowering and check they are properly tied in and supported.
- Prune wisterias. Ideally they need cutting twice a year: once now July/August-time and the second cut towards the end of winter in January/February-time. Cut back any new whippy fresh-green growth to about 5 or 6 leaves. Tie all loose ends in neatly to maintain form and structure. At the end of winter cut the wisteria back even more just to really tidy it up.



Community Speed Watch - Be involved

Baydon's Community Speedwatch (CSW) scheme has been running for 5 months now and has caught hundreds of vehicles speeding through the village.



The details of the speeding motorists have been reported to Wiltshire Police and the Police have, as a result, been in Baydon a number of times to carry out as hoc police speed checks.

The all important question? What happens to those logged as speeding? The first time they get a letter from the police. Second time they get a much sterner letter. And the third time they attract the direct attention of the police. But a prosecution cannot be based on data collected by the volunteers.

And be warned: CSW information is kept centrally at Wiltshire Police headquarters. So your 'third time' could have been logged by any one of the forty-seven active CSW schemes across the county.
