From the Minister...

WELCOME TO OUR NEW TEAM CURATE – Revd Karen Rizzello

It is good to be able to welcome a new member of the Whitton Team. Karen Rizzello was ordained Deacon on 26th June and joins the Whitton churches as an Assistant Curate. It is more than two years since Sue Rodd finished her period of training as Assistant Curate and was licensed as a self-supporting Team Vicar, so we felt it would be useful to remind us what it means to have a new curate in training.

In the Anglican Church, initial training falls into two parts - first, there is the time spent in Theological College or on a Course dealing with the building blocks of ministry and our faith, followed by a period where these things are tested and tried out and reflected upon. This second phase of formation normally takes place in a parish and we should see it as a continuation of Karen's training. We expect that Karen will be part of the Team for the next 3-4 years.

Christian ministry is all about partnership; being part of the 'body of Christ'. Over the years we have had a varied team of ordained and lay ministers here. It is good to have Karen with us as a curate and we know that she has much to contribute and share with us. We need, however, to remember that she is self-supporting and part-time; so she will be around but not always available, as she has commitments beyond the parishes here.

It was lovely to have a special welcome for Karen on Sunday 3rd July at the Team Service in Aldbourne and we look forward to sharing in church and community life over the next few years.

Mr Chambers Retires from Baydon School

After 24 years Mr Chambers retired from Baydon St Nicholas at the end of the summer term in July.

A service was held for him in the church on Sunday 17th July followed by a reception in a packed school hall. Staff and pupils, both past and present joined governors, parents and villagers. In the school hall there were many pictures of Peter at the school over his time as Head. The walls were also adorned by pictures, from the pupils, who had each drawn a picture of their headmaster.



Speeches were given by the Governors: Lesley Whelan, Bridget Walker and a speech from Denise Mathewson, read by Bridget on her behalf.

Peter was presented with gifts from the Governors.

Peter then gave a speech accompanied by his wife Helen. His speech summed up his time at Baydon St Nicholas very well and is printed on the following page.

On Wednesday 20th July 2016, the school gave a retirement tribute to Mr Chambers in the Church. It was a time of laughter and tears as each class gave their contribution to the service.

Skylarks class began with their own version of Farewell from the Sound of Music.



Goldfinches had written an acrostic poem describing Mr Chamber's qualities.

Robins reminded him of his favourite Easter song "I am a spring chicken", singing and doing the actions.

Kites put on a "Strictly Come Baydon" sketch with Mr Chambers being coerced into acting as one of the four judges.

In their prayers the children spoke of his constant and strong leadership over the 24 years.

Kites brought in photographs of a fresh young head, and many more of the past years.

Mrs Lisa Bond presented Mr Chambers with a large book, from all the children's families. Mrs Amanda Bond and Ben Harris presented a gift from Wagtails, the after school club. Mr Chambers then gave the school an indoor bench for the library.

The whole service closed with children's prayers and a song from their recent production "Circle of Life" from the Lion King.

I never thought that I would see the day when I would be standing here giving a retirement speech.

I was seconded for just half a term! Well here I am 24 years later. My first experience of Baydon was one dark, gloomy December Sunday afternoon. Where was Baydon? As we drove all we could see was one solitary street light! We drove past the school and out of the village... Eventually the school came into view.

My first experience of the school was one excitable boy running from the hall into the toilets and doing a Karate kick with his feet! Hmm! My second was being told by a member of the WI that I could do anything I like in the school as long as I left enough space for two tea trays. My challenge was set. There was no turning back. I had already said I would do the job.

There were only three classes then in 1992, two full time teachers, one part time teacher with whom I would share a class. At that time there were 56 children. I had left a school with 800 children. During my first Worship, I found myself waiting for and looking around to see where all the others were... I had to adapt pretty quickly.

After a year, I applied for the permanent Headship and obviously got it. During the same year I was married to Helen, moved to Aldbourne as well as celebrating the school's 150th birthday. A busy year. When I arrived one class was taught in the Hall. My first job was to commission the mobile classroom (now Kites). This was a fantastic new addition to the school as it was basically a Victorian building with a 1960s extension and limited facilities for staff and children.

Many changes have happened since.

Magpies was built on the end of the Hall as a Craft, Design and Technology room.

Goldfinches (outside permanent class) was planned and built. This provided the largest teaching space in the school.

The biggest improvement came five years ago when there were major improvements to most areas of the school. At last dedicated office space was provided rather than the use of a Victorian bedroom! Two new classes were also built ready to accommodate the ever increasing numbers. Wow! what a difference, underfloor heating (warm feet for the first time) light and airy rooms as well as windows that you were not afraid of opening in case they would not close or fall off their hinges.

During all these changes and OFSTED inspections I always considered moving on. However, Matthew was born and of course family had to come first. I decided to stay put.

We moved into the village having said that I would never live where I worked. We saw the house, yet again, on a miserable, damp day but realised it was meant for us.

This school is very special and has an important place in our village; it is central, pivotal and this has been reinforced more recently by the many kind messages I have received in letters and cards.

The children here have been amazing; I am not sure how many I have taught over the last 38 years. I think that it is definitely time to go when you start employing someone who you taught at Baydon and also someone else whose child is starting here in September!

My original role here was to build relationships with staff, children, governors, church and community and I hope that I have achieved all these things and to create an environment where family, faith and celebrating achievement was central to everything. I think the sports day this year summed up everything that I stand for.

It has been a privilege, it has been hard work and it has been rewarding in so many ways. So, thank you everyone for your part in my journey (whether you are a child, teacher, governor, parent, villager, friend, colleague, ex pupil) and especially to Helen and Matthew without you all this would not have been possible.

Thank you everyone for sharing this special day to celebrate my years as Headteacher.

Parish Council Corner

Parish Steward Scheme returns to Baydon

A popular scheme where 'parish stewards' liaise with parishes to carry out local minor highways work swiftly and efficiently is coming back to Wiltshire from the 1st October. There will be a steward appointed to serve Baydon, details to be confirmed.

The Parish Steward Scheme will replace the Community Days Scheme where a group of officers provided one day's work of activities within an extended time period. Under the new scheme, Baydon will have regular visits for minor works providing a much more frequent service. The parish steward will report issues and undertake repairs and maintenance, meaning they are a 'one stop and done' service.

What can Baydon expect from this Scheme?

Our steward will help prioritise the needs of Baydon including roads, pathways, drains and verge maintenance, with a remit which can include painting railings, high strimming and undertaking minor pothole repairs.

The top five priorities agreed by the Baydon Parish Council for the Steward:

1. Keep road signs clearly visible for drivers (e.g. 30mph sign in Manor Lane completely hidden by foliage)
2. Cut back manageable branch overhang on corner (e.g. Aldbourne Road corner)
3. Clip trunk bases of growth to maximise visibility for drivers (e.g. Aldbourne Road corner)
4. Cut grass at village gates
5. Keep pavements clear to edging.

Update on Traffic Calming for Baydon

As advertised, a traffic calming information session was held during the Parish Council Meeting on Monday 4 July and 18 residents attended. Minutes, plus other traffic calming related documents are available on www.baydon.org and the Parish Council noticeboard, situated outside Baydon Parish Office and Stores.

Concerns were again expressed around the safety of the buildout proposed for the western end of Ermin Street. Cllrs agreed to request an independent safety inspection of Wiltshire Highways plans and the proposed location, before the project is progressed any further. Residents also requested that the Parish Council investigate the possibility of speed bumps.

Once you have taken your medication away from the surgery it cannot be reused and will have to be incinerated, even if it is unopened. All medication has an expiry date, please do not stock pile medication.

When ordering your repeat medication online please remember to allow 48 working hours before arranging collection. If you order online over a weekend the 48 working hours does not start until the Monday morning, therefore your medication will be ready to collect on Wednesday. We are receiving an increasing number of patients who order online over a weekend and turn up to collect the medication on a Monday.

If you are aged 18 on 31st August 2016 you are eligible for the Meningitis ACW&Y vaccination. To be eligible for this vaccination you must be a permanent registered patient at the surgery, we are unable to offer this vaccination to temporary residents. Please contact the surgery to arrange a convenient appointment as soon as possible.

Travel Vaccinations

If you are travelling this summer and think you may well require some travel vaccinations please complete our travel form as soon as possible. The form is available from the surgery or can be completed via the surgery website.

Test Results

If you have had a test carried out at the surgery, please contact the surgery for your results one week after the test date. Your Doctor will not automatically contact you with your test results. This applies to all forms of tests, blood, urine samples etc.

Online Access

Please note when children reach the age of 14 their online access will cease. Parents will not be able to continue with proxy access for their children after this age. We hope you all understand that due to patient confidentiality we must adhere to these regulations.

Mobile Telephone Numbers

Please keep your contact details up to date, especially your mobile telephone number. It is very important that your Doctor can contact you at all times.

As you are aware transport to and from the Surgery is provided every Tuesday and Thursday morning by the Practice for our patients. 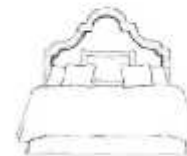
Baydon Recital and Cream Tea, 24th September 2016

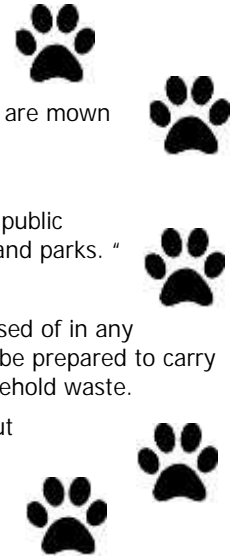
"Dog owners must, by law, pick up any mess made by their pets in public places such as roads, footpaths, school playing fields, sports fields and parks. "

Colin Yeo spoke on behalf of the Baydon Social Group which meets on the second Thursday of each month. The group put together their own programme each year consisting of trips, walks and talks. More members are very welcome, he added. The next trip will be a historical walk around Hungerford on the 14th July.

Alison Tomkin spoke on behalf of the Aldbourne and Baydon Link Scheme which gives lifts to people on mainly health related journeys or shopping trips. This is its 10th year and it has 38 volunteers. More are needed, she said, as demand may increase if the local bus services are cut in the future. Finances are healthy as donations keep up with expenses.

Rob Howes said that the Baydon Flyers (cycle club) have been in existence for 3 years. They ride out from the Red Lion 20 to 30 miles each Thursday evening. Encouragement is provided and the group return to the pub for refreshments. There are currently 10 members who have also enjoyed Bike Festivals and trip to Flanders.

Mark Austen reported that it was his 10th year of looking after the Baydon Website. He reminded everyone about the facilities on the website, the focus on news and events in and around the village, having a section for all areas of the local community including the school, pub, shop and church to village groups and the Parish Council, together with a live webcam overlooking the Village Green. Mark encouraged the leaders of groups to keep him updated with new events so that they can be fully promoted. On average around 130 people per day had looked at the website over the last month.

Laura Gregory spoke on behalf of the BYPA Committee. The focus this year was to maintain the existing fabric but, she added, the BYPA Hall was an aging building. It has been agreed to advertise the Hall's facilities further afield. The hourly rate is to be increased but it will still be competitive.

Jim Grove reported from the Firework Committee on another successful event on the Cricket Field this year. £325.65 was in the kitty towards the next event. This year all fireworks will be let off electronically. The equipment to do this cost £1,800. A grant of £930.00 was received from the Marlborough Area Board, but fundraising is ongoing for the rest. The committee did a display for the Aldbourne Carnival and also lit the beacon for the Queen's 90th birthday celebration. Thanks were extended to Jonathan Smith for use of the field.

The meeting closed at 8.10pm, after which refreshments were provided.

Baydon Parish Assembly 2016

A very informal Parish Assembly was held in the School Hall on Monday 27th June 2016. The meeting was chaired by Cllr Tamsin Witt who stated that an update of Parish affairs was to be seen in the next Scene in Baydon. She also mentioned the additional play equipment in the Parish playground, the new Parish Clerk and one new Parish councillor Cllr Amy Bryan (who was helping by serving drinks at the meeting).

Cllr Witt said that no one was present from Little Crickets pre-school, but they had sent a brief report.

Peter Chambers, head teacher of St Nicholas School gave his report next. He stated that there were 128 children on the role at present, 17 of which will be moving on to secondary school this July. There are 15 new children starting in September.

The school had, he said, an active Governing Body which is seeking one additional Foundation Governor. Friends of Baydon School have had a successful year raising money for iPads. The school maintains good relations with the Church, added Mr Chambers, and joint services have been well attended. Wagtails (Wrap around care) currently have around 10 children before school am and 20 after school pm. The school is thriving and he felt happy that after 24 years as head he was retiring leaving the values of Faith, Family and Achievement fully embedded in the ethos of the school. Mrs Caroline Knightley from Aldbourne will be taking over as head teacher in September.

Michael Ball from the PCC said that the average attendance at Church on a Sunday was 19, with up to 60 adult and 20 children on special services. The Church was open all day, every day and everyone is welcome. This year has seen 1 baptism, 1 wedding and sadly a great number of funerals. Thanks were extended to the Parish Council for help in maintaining the church clock and graveyard. Donations of time, materials and money over the past year, he added, have helped towards maintaining the fabric of the church but a great deal more is needed.

Julie Wyatt from the Red Lion Public House explained that she has been running the pub almost single handed for the last 18 months or so. She thanked those who had supported her, but was just not getting enough trade for the pub to survive. Julie is very keen to hear from the local community with suggestions and ideas of what people in the village would like to get from their local pub and so encourage people along more often. The B&B has recently taken off and helped the situation. Such events as the Community Lunches would continue, the pub remains available to hire for local functions and everyone is very welcome to come along to the next Ladies Night taking place on Friday 15th July (a Gentlemen's Night is also planned for September). This coming Friday to Sunday sees the Baydon Beer and Cider Festival with various things going on from live music, to car treasure hunt, BBQ and Quiz so do please come along if you can.

Obituary: Edith Hollander (1927 – 2016)

The funeral of Edith Hollander was held at St. Nicholas Church Baydon on Friday 15th July 2016. The service was led by Rev. Hayward Osborne, Edith's son-in-law.

In his address the Rev Osborne said that Edith had had a good life, was well liked and respected by all.

She was born in Frankfurt Germany on the border with Poland. Her father's family were Jewish and her mother's Christian. As an only child she led a happy carefree life. She learnt English at her grammar school which stood her in good stead later. When she was only eleven she was woken up in the night to see the Synagogue going up in flames. Extremely worried about the terror evolving in Germany. Edith's parents got her on to the Kinder Transport in March 1939 (when she was just 11 years old). When she reached England she was sent to the Barnardo's home in Rippon. From there it was decided that she, now aged 16, should train to be a Nursery nurse. She later worked in the Bristol home.

In 1945 Edith returned to Germany to find her traumatised mother and just a farewell letter from her father. They never saw him again. However she then met John, who had also recently returned to his homeland. They returned to England together with nothing, and married in 1948.

The couple had a happy life together in Kent and produced daughter Sandra and twin boys David and Tony. Edith worked in a doctor's surgery for a time, where her sensitivity and kindness was appreciated by patients and doctors alike.

When the children were all married the couple moved to Baydon to run the Post Office Stores. Edith was loved and respected in the village being part of the Women's Institute, Gardening Club, and Church and as a volunteer with Stroke Victims.

When finally they retired they had a house built in the grounds behind the shop, where they lived until they moved to Marlborough. Edith always gave a wonderful welcome to her grandchildren and great grandchildren, and any friends who visited there could expect great hospitality. Edith cared for her husband John until he moved to a care home.

The couple loved Baydon and felt that it was their real home – deciding to be buried together in the Churchyard when their time came.

After John's death Edith found the fascination of the internet, much to the amazement and delight of her 10 grandchildren. She wrote a book about her life, which was published entitled "Sunshine and Showers".

Edith was both ordinary and remarkable, said the Rev Osborne. She moved to a nursing home in Kent two years ago and finally slipped away quietly in the night, 26th June 2016.

Grandson Joseph read from the New Testament, and granddaughter read a poem written by Edith. Donations were made to the Alzheimer's Support for Wiltshire Refreshments were enjoyed at the Red Lion Pub after the burial.
