

Sir Isaac Newton

A talk was given by Denys Cook on Friday 10 November in the school hall that was attended by 50 people from Baydon and surrounding villages and raised over £429. We all enjoyed this amusing and very informative evening on Sir Isaac's connection with Baydon. Denys had done a huge amount of research to find the truth, the whole truth and nothing but the truth. He told us how Sir Isaac was ranked second on a list of people who had been the most influential in history and was rated as greatest scientist of all time. Also, he read us articles written in the 1892 about the house Sir Isaac had lived in, as well as another written in 1927 in the same vein, these both turned out to be myths.

Denys kept us in suspense as to the truth and it turned out Sir Isaac did own Finches Farm house with 135 acres, but he never even visited Baydon and had bought the property to leave to relatives!

There were craft stalls, a raffle and Cheese and Wine and socialising which was thoroughly enjoyed too.

From the Minister...

One of the joys of our frequent visits to our boat in the Brecon Beacons is the way the colours of the landscape are constantly changing – from the pale shades of spring, through the bright colours of summer and the golds and oranges of autumn;



the same short stretch of canal always looks different, each time we go. Now, in mid-winter, it's mostly greys and browns, though, with occasional bright flashes of new crops coming through.

So it's no wonder that in pre-tinsel, pre-plastic days, people decorated their homes and churches for Christmas using the ever-green holly and ivy that was all the colour there was to hand, to the point where red and green have really "become" the colours of Christmas.

And, as the old carol reminds us, the colours of "the holly and the ivy" remind us of the deeper meaning of Christmas underlying the present-giving, the feasting and the parties. The white of the holly blossom reminds us of the purity of the Christ Child, coming into a dark and sinful world to bring the springing green of new life. But the blood-red of the berries and the sharp prickles on the holly leaves remind us that the gift of the Christ Child at Christmas was a costly one – that the tiny defenceless baby in the manger became the man who lived and suffered and died and rose again for our sake.

We all probably know the disappointment when an expensive present that we've carefully chosen isn't valued or appreciated – or is even trashed – by the recipient. Christmas is a yearly wonderful reminder of just how much God loves us. The way we show we value that gift is to love him in return and to love one another for his sake.

That's why we buy each other presents, and get together with our friends and families to renew bonds of love and friendship, in a celebration of that love.

I wish you a Christmas filled with light and love, and New Year of peace and promise.

In memory of Pam Johnson, who was at one time a member of Baydon WI (no longer in existence) we are reprinting her Apple Galette recipe, as it appeared in the Scene in Dec 2008:

Pam's Apple Galette

Pastry:

Method

10 ozs plain flour Pinch salt 6oz butter (or marg) chilled 1 egg yolk 2 tablespoons cold water

Add the sugar then mix the yolk with water and add Make a firm dough & chill for ½ hour in the fridge (or 10 mins in freezer)

Sift flour & salt, grate butter and rub in

Filling

 1 ½ Ibs bramley apples

 Rind of 1 unwaxed lemon

 Juice of ½ lemon

 4 ozs sultanas

 3 ozs caster sugar

 1 heaped teaspoon cinnamon

Flan

Grease a 9" flan tin which is about 11/2 inches deep

Cut the pastry in half then roll out and line the tin with the pastry. Put in the filling and pop on the pastry lid - press well around the edges to seal Bake at 190 c. Gas no. 5 for about 30-40 mins or until evenly golden Take out of the oven and immediately cover the top

Topping

Heat 3 good tablespoons of apricot jam & spread with a palette knife all over the top

Have ready 3-4 ozs sifted icing sugar mixed with water so that it drizzles off the spoon easily

Drizzle over the jam right to the edges and leave until cold before turning out






