Church Letter

View from the Vicarage

When I started this I was sitting at my desk a few days before Christmas and it was really cold and very wet outside.

ANNUAL MEETINGS 2014

The 'Annual General Meetings' of each Parish Church take place each year before the end of April. The dates of the meetings for the parishes of this Benefice are as follows:

Aldbourne – Monday 3rd March at 7.30pm Baydon – Thursday 1st April at 7.30pm Chilton Foliat – Wednesday 12th March at 7.00pm Froxfield – Tuesday 8th April at 7.30pm Ramsbury with Axford – Tuesday 25th March at 7.30pm

Each AGM is a two-stage process. The first meeting is the **Annual Meeting** of **Parishioners** (sometimes called the 'Vestry Meeting') for the election of churchwardens. Any resident of the Parish is entitled both to attend **and** to vote. whether or not their name is on the church's Electoral Roll.

The second meeting is the **Annual Parochial Church Meeting** at which the principal business is the election of representatives of the laity to the Marlborough Deanery Synod (every three years), the Parochial Church Council and the Whitton Team Council; to receive the churchwardens' report on the state of the church building and contents; and to receive the Treasurer's report. Again, any resident of the Parish is entitled to attend, but ONLY those whose names are on the church's Electoral Roll are entitled to vote in the election of Deanery Synod members, PCC members or Team Councillors, or on any propositions laid before the meeting.

It is important for your Parish Church to have the support of the community, and for YOU to have the opportunity to express your views about the way in which it works. Overleaf you will find the notice convening the meetings and the Agendas. Please come along to the Annual Meetings and play your part in the life of your local Church.


Heads Up!

PARISH COUNCIL CORNER

A précis of Barbara Furber's notes of the January Meeting Full version on baydon.org. Thanks Barbara!

- In public question time, Mr Tony Prior queried the lateness of documents and other clerical errors due to there being 2 vacancies on the council and no Parish Clerk.
- There was much discussion around the footpath diversions of Baydon 2 and part of Footpath Baydon 11. The council did not object.
- A donation request from the Citizens Advice was refused.
- There was a brief update from the Traffic Calming Working Group the contractors have been asked to begin putting in Chicanes near the playground. Cllrs are keen to push for the works to start in early April and it was noted that access to Willow Track was needed by lorries.
- The 2014/15 Precept was discussed Wiltshire CC has asked for 'Like-for-Like' or decrease. Cllr Knowles said he was in favour of keeping the precept the same as this year. Discussion ensued around why the reserves should be as high as they are. It was suggested that if the 2nd Chicane was not built, the monies set aside for this should be returned to residents by reducing the Precept. County Cllr Sheppard said that in theory once the first Chicane was put into place it would be known quite quickly if another one is needed.
- There is no update on the youth worker
- Traditional swings are likely to be ordered soon for the playground although we will need planning permission.
- Approaching 90 people turned up for the Carols around the tree and Mrs Johnson offered the village a tree from her land free next year.
- Allotment Plot 5 has now been let and there is some interest in the position of Parish Clerk but the council are still looking.
- The dog warden has visited the village. Two dog owners are being monitored concerning dog fouling. Notices are going up
- Thanks were extended to Santa for visiting in December and others who helped over Christmas.

"Should I have antibiotics for my cough, runny nose or sore throat Doctor?"

The season of increased viral illnesses is upon us once more. One of the most pressing problems faced by healthcare services around the world is the increasing prevalence of antimicrobial resistance. No new antibiotics have been found over the past two decades, as such we need to reserve antibiotics for those infections that really need them. You can help to ease pressure on the surgery and help yourself by avoiding antibiotics, as they can cause unwanted side effects such as diarrhoea. We hope that a few facts below and some advice on how to manage your illness may help you to stay healthy and avoid unnecessary visits to the surgery.

The average length of a cold is 10-14 days, but many can last between 2-4 weeks.

Adults have an average of between two and four colds a year.

Young children in nursery schools may average up to nine colds during the winter

What treatment can buy in my local pharmacy to try to help my symptoms?

Paracetamol or ibuprofen are effective when used during viral infections to treat symptoms such as sore throat, muscle pain or high fever. Over-the-counter cough mixtures have little or no evidence that they help children. Honey and lemon is probably as good as any formulation. Vapour rubs and inhalant decongestants can be applied to children's clothing to provide relief of a stuffy or blocked nose for children and infants aged over three months. Decongestants provide short-term (3-to 10-hour) relief of congestive symptoms. However, stopping decongestants can make your congestion worse in the short term.

What treatment can I try to help shorten my illness?

Zinc: There is increasingly strong evidence that Zinc reduces the duration and severity of the common cold in healthy people. Zinc supplements taken for at least five months have been found to reduce the incidence of colds, school absenteeism and prescription of antibiotics in children. Zinc lozenges can be purchased at your local pharmacy and are not available on prescription. Side effects are uncommon.

Vitamin C: there is limited evidence that vitamin C slightly reduces the duration of cold symptoms.

Echinacea: there is limited evidence that some preparations of Echinacea may improve cold symptoms compared with placebo. These can be purchased at your local pharmacy.





Support Hayden and...

Hello there

My name is Dawn Howell.

We (my husband Kevin and I) moved to Baydon 13 years ago, and we have two lovely children, Eleanor (8), and Hayden (5).

Sadly, on 14th February 2012 (a day that is now etched in my memory), Hayden was diagnosed with Duchenne Muscular Dystrophy.

We had an idea something was wrong because as a baby/toddler Hayden had been very late in crawling and walking. When he did walk his gait was slightly odd, and just didn't look right, so we had him checked out.

Of course we weren't expecting to be given such devastating news, and in the blink of an eye our lives changed forever.

Looking at him now you wouldn't think anything was wrong. He is a bright bubbly boy with a winning smile, and tons of energy. He loves school, and is doing well. He just needs a little help in PE lessons, and his ability to grip pens, knives, forks etc is a little on the weak side.

However, the effects of this disease are totally devastating, and ultimately life limiting. Unless a treatment can be found, Hayden will be wheelchair bound by the age of 15.

But I do not want to use this space to dwell on Hayden's current prognosis. I would like to tell you about what we are doing to try and change it!

Having investigated several charities (and also looked into the possibility of starting our own), we decided to support Action Duchenne because not only do they focus on the particular type of MD that Hayden has, they are also very clear and open about how the funds they raise are spent.

Here are the basic details of just two of the exciting potential treatments they are helping to fund:

Exon skipping, where the brain is 'tricked' into thinking that his DNA chain is not corrupted. This allows the body to start producing the Dystrophin enzyme again.

Utrophin Upregulation (UU), where the body is encouraged to produce more Utrophin. This is a similar enzyme to Dystrophin, and trials so far seem to suggest that it is capable of taking over the role Dystrophin played, so long as his body produces enough of the stuff.
