Hello All...

Its been a very warm winter so far. I'm very fed-up with mud, but its lovely to see early daffodils and blossom.

Can I draw everyone's attention to Wiltshire Council's survey about bus services in the county. We are under threat of having our services reduced to 2-3 buses a day. I personally believe this is unworkable and will severely restrict those in the village who rely on the buses. For me in particular I am worried about the effect on the young people in the village who rely on the buses to get to school/college. With education now compulsory until 18, bus services are vital. 16-18 year olds do not have the same hours at school/college everyday and this change could severely restrict their choices. Wiltshire is a rural county and funding will be required to provide adequate public transport.

Whatever your thoughts or concerns about this the more people that complete the survey the more chance we have of being heard. Details inside on how to complete the survey.



URGENT St Nicholas Church essential repairs

We have a very beautiful 11th century church that needs our care. The insurance company requires us to do the following repairs in order for the church to be covered and we have run out of building fund money:

- Test 25 Church electric circuits quoted at £426
- Repair the lightning conductors quoted at £517

There is also damage occurring due to rain; in order to stop this water entering the building the Vestry wall needs repointing and the Vestry roof needs repairing. There are many other on going repairs that need addressing but those above require immediate attention.



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Mr Chambers to retire from Baydon St Nicholas



On Wednesday 20th January 2016 Mr Chambers, Head teacher of Baydon St Nicholas primary school announced to the children and staff his decision to retire. He will be leaving the school at the end of term 6 on Friday 22nd July 2016.

Mr Chambers has led our school for 24 years, brilliantly supporting and guiding children through their primary years of education with such skill and dedication. He is a role model for the school motto of Family, Faith and Celebrating Achievement. He has created a lasting legacy, building a great team of teachers and support staff, giving the school a strong platform to move forward with.

Mr Chambers said "I have spent 24 happy years at the school and have worked with many wonderful staff, children, parents and a very supportive Governing Body. I have seen the school grow tremendously since first

starting the Headship, not only in pupil numbers but also in the cementing of relationships within the community and church.

It has been an honour and privilege to lead this school for such a long time to see children develop and flourish and be happy in their learning. I shall be very sorry to leave but I know I am leaving it in safe hands of the Governing Body"

We have started the process to recruit a new head teacher working with consultants from the diocese and local authority developing our plans to secure a new exceptional leader for our school in September 2016.

We recognise this announcement may lead to questions, to support this our Parent Governors Emma Harton -Carter, Amanda Hodey and Foundation Governors Paula Bartlett and Fiona Smart will be available before and after school this week to answer as many as they can.

We want the children, staff and parents to be fully briefed on the succession plan and we will send out a further communication on Monday 25th January outlining the recruitment timetable.

There will be many opportunities to look forward however today let us look back on an exceptional career.

As we move closer to Mr. Chambers retirement date we will join together to celebrate his outstanding contribution to our school and community.

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
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The Great Baydon Bake Off 2016 Saturday 5th March

All funds raised will again be going to Action Duchenne, as they tirelessly work towards finding a cure for Duchenne Muscular Dystrophy and improving the lives of those living with the condition. Having learnt a thing or two from the last two Bake Offs, we have made a few adjustments to the format:

The following classes will be open for entries -

- Children's class (with help from parent/adult)
- Under 16s (without assistance)
- Adults class
- Bread/Rolls (no age limit)

With trophies and prizes for 1st, 2nd, and 3rd in each class, plus 'thank you' prizes for all entrants.

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



ANNUAL MEETING 2016

The 'Annual General Meetings' of each Parish Church take place each year before the end of April. The date of the meeting for Baydon is:

Wednesday 13th April at 7.30pm

Each AGM is a two-stage process. The first meeting is the **Annual Meeting of Parishioners** (sometimes called the 'Vestry Meeting') for the election of churchwardens. Any resident of the Parish is entitled both to attend **and to vote**, whether or not their name is on the church's Electoral Roll.

The second meeting is the **Annual Parochial Church Meeting** at which the principal business is the election of representatives of the laity to the Marlborough Deanery Synod (every three years), the Parochial Church Council and the Whitton Team Council; to receive the churchwardens' report on the state of the church building and contents; and to receive the Treasurer's report. Again, any resident of the Parish is entitled to attend, but ONLY those whose names are on the church's Electoral Roll are entitled to vote in the election of Deanery Synod members, PCC members or Team Councillors, or on any propositions laid before the meeting.

It is important for your Parish Church to have the support of the community, and for YOU to have the opportunity to express your views about the way in which it works. Please come along to the Annual Meetings and play your part in the life of your local Church.

BUS SERVICE CONSULTATION

Wiltshire council are undertaking a review of subsidised bus services in Wiltshire. The current services in Baydon are subsidised by the council.

Here is what the council says:

Wiltshire Council currently spends £5.1 million a year supporting bus routes that would not be commercially viable on their own. This supports nearly half of all bus journeys in Wiltshire and is a level of support well above surrounding counties. Due to financial pressure the Council can no longer guarantee this level of support and is therefore looking at a number of options to reduce the number of bus routes it supports. As yet no decisions have been taken. We want your views so we can make the right decision so please take the survey below, it should take no more than 5 minutes and all your responses will be treated as confidential. Whether you are a regular bus user or one who rarely uses a bus it's important you have your say.

Please note that around 50% of bus services in Wiltshire are operated commercially by the main bus operators and are not under threat, as they do not need a subsidy to run. If you need to look at which routes could be affected you can find this on the consultation portal under 'supporting documents'.
