Date for your diary – Friday 13 April 2018 Tim Williams talking about the extraordinary owners of his deHavilland Puss Moth

This witty and interesting talk is about the first four owners of his deHavilland Puss Moth. It was given to an American millionaire for her 21st birthday in 1930; she led a dazzling life. Tim knew her well in her old age. She soon sold it and it went to Egypt under interesting circumstances, and became the first aircraft to make a commercial flight there. After a time the ownership passed to a crook who had a shady career and a girl friend who became a belly dancer and film star. She died in mysterious circumstances after becoming a spy during the war. It then went to India and was owned by a well-known sportsman and private pilot to The Maharaja of Patiala. All this before returning to England in 1936. Tim has known people who knew all these owners and in the 35 years that he has owned it, he has amassed a good number of stories, pictures and even some films.

OBITUARY

Clifford Frederick Tom Cowles 25th September 1930 – 02nd January 2018



Cliff was born in the village of Aldbourne on the 25th September 1930, making him a Dabchick. He lived in Aldbourne along with his two brothers Raymond and Tony. Cliff met his future wife Diana Hunt at a dance in the village. They married on August 27th 1955 in Baydon St Nicholas Church, and moved to Baydon. After renting the Old Vicarage for 11 months they finally moved to Tubbs Farm where Cliff lived for the next 62 years.

After leaving school at 14, he worked at a local bakery and joined the Aldbourne Platoon ACF. When he was 20 he started working as a carpet fitter at furniture company Spillers, in Old Town, Swindon. He worked here for 45 years.


He was on the church council in Baydon for 25 years and after retirement he used to help out at Baydon School assisting with swimming, reading, and cycling proficiency with the late Stan Titcombe. Cliff enjoyed taking the entry money on the gate at the School and Church fete, and did so every year for 62 years, and only gave it up last year due to ill health.

Cliff was very proud of where he was from and was a valued member of Ramsbury brass band, as the band sergeant carrying the mace. He was especially proud of the coach company Barnes that use to operate in Aldbourne.

Cliff was a loving father to two daughters, Julie and Sarah and father in law to Paul Rolfe and Shane Dent. Cliff doted on his four Grandchildren Katherine, Alice, Jessica and Ryan.

There was standing room only at the funeral service, with over 150 mourners, on Thursday 18th January 2018 in St Nicholas Church Baydon.

Since the last Scene Muttley has...

... racked up some vets bills

Before Christmas, due to a miscommunication he had access to the rising raw dough of a large loaf of bread. He devoured the entire lot. Bread dough can continue to rise in a dogs stomach and the fermenting yeast can be toxic. We contacted the vets and it was agreed it was best he was taken down to them and given an injection to force him to "return" the dough. And so a Saturday afternoon (out of hours) was spent at the vets waiting for Muttley to return the dough. Fortunately he reacts to the injection quickly (we know this from experience) so it wasn't long before the vet was happy he had



returned it al—yes she did weigh it! He came home a little shaky, but of course still wanted his dinner a short time later—not much stops Muttley eating...

Incident number 2 took place after Christmas. A very sick Muttley woke me at 6 am and constantly wanted to go outside to be sick. It took until daylight for me to realise the problem—he had somehow (we still don't know how), got the remains of the night before's casserole out of the bin. Chicken skin, cream and bones. He had thrown up sharp pieces of bone in the garden. I whisked a very sorry for himself dog down to the vets and they ended up keeping him in for the day—partly due to a worry about sharp bones still being in him and partly because he clearly felt so unwell. He ended up being sedated and x-rayed. No more bones present.

It didn't end there, two days later we were back at the vets as he was still not himself—lots of whining and sighing and generally lack lustre. He was put on



sensitive food and given various gastric drugs, but asked to return the following day just in case it had turned to pancreatitis. Fortunately he was much improved by the next day (Sunday—we like doing out of hours visits to the vets) and he recovered completely. Needless to say, through out it, although feeling unwell he was still very happy to eat at any time.

Will he learn from this experience? No. He stole my packed lunch before I'd finished making it a couple of days ago,. He's just more unsure about trips to the vet!

You will appreciate that appointments are limited in their number and if you fail to attend your appointment, it essentially means that you have prevented another patient getting to see the Doctor or Nurse. If you are unable to attend your appointment, please contact Reception to cancel.

Keep Antibiotics Working

Wiltshire Clinical Commissioning Group is supporting the National 'Keep

Antibiotics Working Campaign' to highlight the risk associated with taking antibiotics when you don't need them and are encouraging patients to listen to the medical

advice from their Doctor.

Taking antibiotics encourages bacteria that lives inside you to become resistant, meaning the antibiotics may not work when you really need them to. This can put you and your family at risk of a more severe or longer illness. We are asking for you to play your part by trusting your Doctor as to when you need to take antibiotics.

Data Sharing

Did you know that you are in control of who has access to your

health record? We want to help you understand what this means and help you to make a decision about sharing your health record. The Receptionists have a leaflet that clearly explains "Consent to Share" - please ask for one as we need to gain "explicit consent" from every single patient. You can choose from one of the following options:

Yes —I consent to sharing my record

No —I do not consent to record sharing—except in an emergency

No—I do not consent to record sharing even in an emergency

These three options are explained fully on the leaflet from the Receptionists. Please do ask for one and complete it so we can update your Medical Record.

Review – Hidden Figures

I finally saw this film, released earlier this year, which chronicles the mathematical and engineering contributions of a group of "women of colour" to NASA's project to put astronaut John Glenn into orbit and bring him safely back to earth the 1960s – a time when that part of the world still practiced racial segregation. I was struck by the women's dignity, their guiet, steady determination, their calm confidence in their intelligence and knowledge of their subjects, and their sense of being pioneers, in overcoming the habits of prejudice among their white, almost exclusively male, colleagues. Some of these colleagues acted defensively or dismissively or even resentfully; all came to recognise and respect the outstanding abilities and the guality of the work



these women did. Katherine Johnson's calculations and judgment enabled the safe re-entry of Glenn's craft, despite damage to the heat shields. Dorothy Vaughan became a foremost expert in programming one of the earliest IBM computers. Mary Jackson became the first female engineer to take classes at the heretofore all white, male engineering college and work for NASA.

The 1960s are within living memory. My parents' generation fought for equal pay for equal work; I don't know what it was like to fight that fight, or live in a culture where it was normal and acceptable to pay a woman less than a man for the same job. I haven't suffered that discrimination; I've met nothing but encouragement in my field, although I've come across other women in other areas who have had to tackle negative discrimination. However, studies in recent years have repeatedly shown that women are still paid less than men (although I don't know the details of those statistics) but we do now live in an age where such discrimination can be subject to legal redress, and where society should be able to benefit from the full talents of all its members.




