

Clergy letter...

Once we have got into the New Year, people begin to look ahead to the future. The prospects for this year do look rather gloomy; although success against the Australian cricket team in Australia does lift the spirits a little. Undoubtedly the economic and employment situation will be tough and many of us will be affected, either directly or through members of our families.

The Christian faith has a good deal to say about steadfastness and about hope. The pages of the Bible are littered with the cries of those who are displaced, facing economic hardship, political exile or family tragedy. What it reminds us is that, however difficult things are at present, these are often part of cycles. The writer of the book of Ecclesiastes (in words written 3,000 years ago) says: 'There is a time for everything, and a season for every activity under heaven: a time to be born and a time to die, a time to plant and a time to uproot, a time to kill and a time to heal, a time to tear down and a time to build, a time to weep and time to laugh, a time to mourn and a time to dance a time to tear and a time to mend, a time to be silent and a time to speak, a time to love and a time to hate, a time for war and a time for peace.'

The words of Ecclesiastes are bleak but not without hope. In the Christian faith we have a confidence in God's love for the world he created and for a personal care for each one of us. If he sees the fall of the sparrow, observes Jesus, how much more does God

notice and care for those who place their trust in him.

During dry spells the situation became desperate for local people. Wells lost their levels and ponds and storage tanks petered out.

The village pump was sited by the roadside in front of the school;



pumping and dipping were both laborious and unproductive at times. Four other wells supplied the village, by the grace of their owners. These were at East Leaze, Field Barn, Bailey Hill and Manor Farm - this last reputed to be very deep. There was also a very large storage tank sunk in a hollow beside the bridle track at Greenhill.

Every house and farm had tanks to catch the precious rain-water from roofs. St Nicholas' Church tower was even used as a catchment area. A pipe, leading down, ran under the Churchyard to a sunken tank, where the cattle trough is now. The villagers often referred to this as 'Holy-


water', and some say that, despite the many interments, no digging has since uncovered the undisputed water-pipe.

Farm ponds, as long as supplies lasted, were used by humans as well as cattle. There were about twelve of these around the parish. One native resident recalls how his mother used to send him out to a pond to collect water. On many occasions he had to skim away the green slime before obtaining a meagre supply.




Jack Naish: 1902 - 1995.

And now for something really scrumptious!

Sweetheart Biccies

You'll need:

1 medium egg	2-3 drops vanilla extract
75g (3 oz) caster sugar	100g (4 oz) butter or marg
200g (7 oz) Plain Flour	Pinch salt
50g (2 oz) polenta or semolina	
To decorate: 250g (9 oz) Icing sugar	Pink food colouring

Makes about 30 and they can be frozen

Method

- Position the oven shelves towards the top of the oven & preheat to 200 degrees (180 fan ovens - Gas mark 6). Lightly grease 2 baking trays
- 2. Beat the egg, vanilla and sugar together with a wooden spoon
- 3. Put the butter into another mixing bowl with 150g flour and salt. Beat with a wooden spoon until smooth and creamy. Gradually beat the egg and sugar mixture in. Add the rest of the flour and the polenta/semolina and mix to make a smooth dough
- 4. Turn out onto a lightly floured worktop and roll out until 5mm thick. Cut with heart shaped cutter and pop onto baking trays.
- 5. Bake for 16-18 mins until golden brown. Cool for a few mins on the trays then transfer to wire rack to cool
- 6. Make icing up with a little water and 1-2 drops of food colouring and decorate. Add sparkles and edible flowers etc!
- 7. Mooch up together and savour!

Several annual occasions were especially looked forward to. Baydon Fair was held every summer, in the field opposite the School, where the Council houses are now. It lasted a week and Messrs Edwards and Jennings provided the usual roundabouts, swing-boats, stalls etc.

Baydon Flower Show was held in Upper Barn Meadow. In addition to the normal activities of such functions, an evening sports programme was arranged - superintended by the redoubtable Fred Lawrence - and a welcome feature was the presence of the Aldbourne Band. Other diversions, dear to the hearts of those young and active enough to make the journeys, were the Marlborough Mops, Aldbourne Feasts and the fairs held in every town or village. Several villagers, happily still with us, remember walking long distances to enjoy the excitements of these occasions.

One other diversion of those days is of sufficient importance to merit mention: - poaching. There were rich 'pickings' of rabbits, hares and game for those who were daring, skilful and unscrupulous enough to make their secret forays. Cut logs were a temptation too. A story is told of a local farmer, suffering unduly from thefts from his log pile, determined to lay the thief, so he plugged a twelve-bore cartridge into one log and left it in an inviting position in the pile. The next week a suspected local poacher, who could never be caught in the act, had his fireplace shattered.

Not one of the main services that we take so much for granted today came to Baydon until well after the first World War. Gas came to the village in the 1920's; water and electricity in the 1930's; drainage in the late 1950's and street lighting in the 1960's.

By far the most important domestic problem was the supply of water. At an altitude of around 800 feet, and without a single water course the size of a large brook, Baydon was literally high and dry for varying periods of the year.

Episode 7 - Pastimes and Essential Services

By popular demand, we're repeating the History of Baydon by Jack Naish which was serialised in Scene many moons ago. With oodles of thanks to Mo Lafford for collecting all of the editions together again.

Household chores, as has been noted, were very time consuming. Men had to patch shoes, cultivate gardens and rear pigs and poultry to eke out the family budget. With no mains services of water, gas, electricity or drainage available, women were tremendously hard worked. Washing, heating and lighting took much time. Water had to be collected from well or pump, wood collected from copse or hedgerow, and oil lamps needed trimming and filling every night. Sometimes dried cow-dung was collected for burning.

But Sundays, for the majority of families, were days of rest when, if you were respectable, you dressed in 'Sunday best' and sat sedately in the sitting-room - seldom used on any other day of the week - between Church services and Sunday School. The 'Sunday Companion' and similar publications were the only approved literature, apart from the Bible.

On weekdays, children played various games that have long since been discontinued. Many of these were simple diversions dependent upon home-made equipment such as rag balls, sticks and the like. 'Burn-ball', a kind of rounders, was played on the Village Green; 'Erki', a type of hide-and-seek included manipulations with a tin; 'Kiver' needed a tin in a circle marked out in the mud or dust in the road; 'Tip-cat' was played with a stick used to smite a small wooden bit, pointed at both ends, after the latter had been jumped into the air by a sharp tap. Marbles, hoop-bowling, hop-scotch, skittles and the usual make-believe games involving acting and dressing up were also played.
