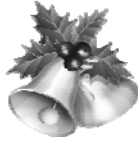

Dear All

We are in the midst of Autumn winds and showers which occasionally give way to beautiful sunshine hi-lighting the changing colours of the hedgerows and trees. The different shades of orange, green, red and brown are glorious in their beautiful combinations and soon we will settle on the reds and greens of Christmas. Colours of life and joy.

Life that comes from the knowledge of Jesus' birth and his death and resurrection; joy that comes from the knowledge of God being with us in Jesus Christ.

It is through God's love for each of us that God sent Jesus to live amongst us, to die amongst us and to rise before us to give us the hope of rising too into the presence of our God and King.

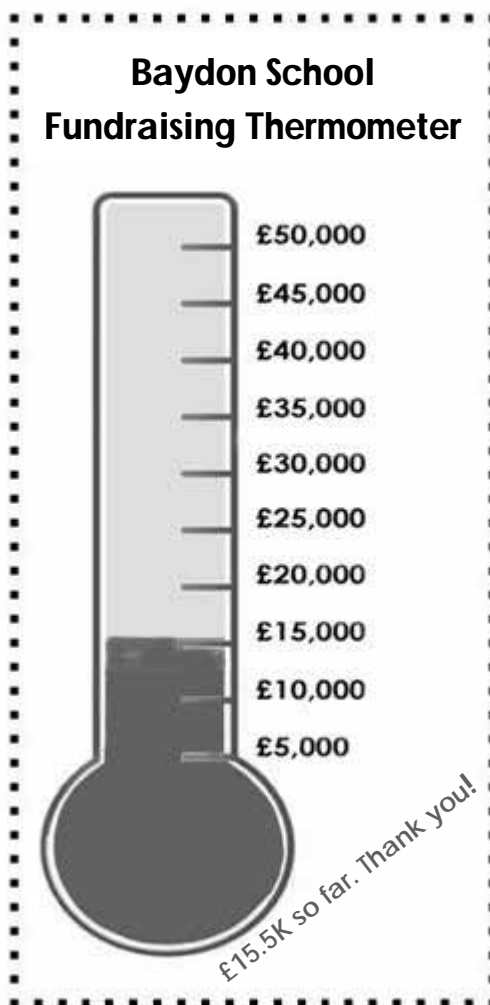
The village has really come together to support this project - a **HUGE** thank you to everyone!

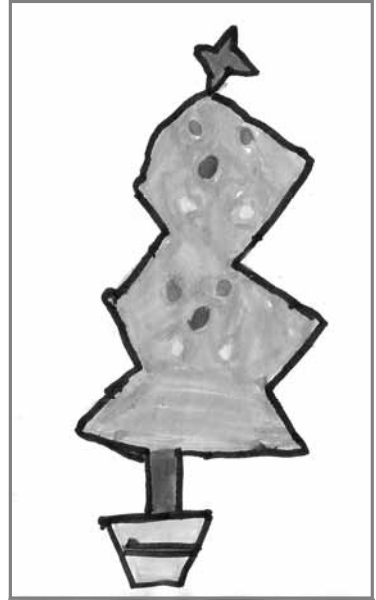

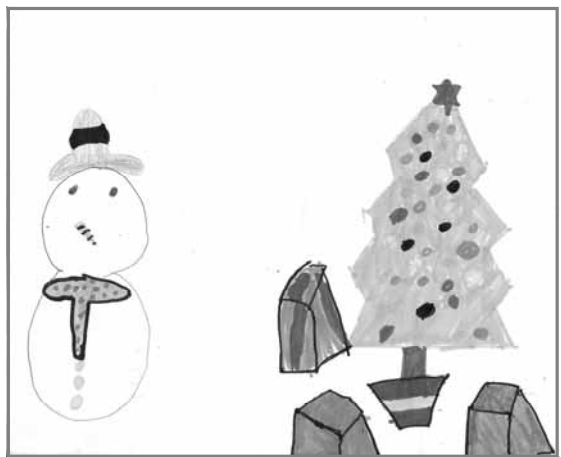

Silent Nuisance Telephone Calls

There are numerous companies using something called "POWERDIALERS". If you keep getting silent calls before being hung up on, then you could be suffering from these POWERDIALER nuisance calls.

These companies dial hundreds of numbers and when you answer, if you're lucky, you get a salesperson trying to sell you something. If you're unlucky you get cut off - or should that be the other way round!

If you dial 1471 and get the reply "WE DO NOT HAVE THE CALLERS NUMBER", then that last call was made from outside the UK and was probably a sales company. It is NOT the same as 'number withheld' which is for UK based calls only.

Get them stopped by registering every year with Silent Call Guard on 0844 372 2325. It is endorsed by BT and it's FREE.

It takes 48 hours to sort itself out, but will stop a large percentage of sales calls that originate in the UK getting through to you - Don't ask me how it works, it just does !

Parish Council Meeting of October 19th

Cllr Tony Prior chaired the meeting and began by making a plea for people to fill the 3 vacancies on the Parish Council. The meeting highlights were:

- * Mrs Rowan Cockcroft was to begin as Parish Clerk at the next meeting
- * The road saltbox in Manor Lane had been removed and the Parish Council agreed to look into the matter as well as the street light in Manor Lane that needs attention.
- * The application for an extension to 8 Ermin Close had been refused.
- * The fence around the new driveway entrance into Finches Farm will need retrospective planning
- * Debbie Moxon, Baydon Post Office Stores, has been asked to provide a shorter Christmas tree than last year, and Mr Jim Grove has agreed to dig the hole for the tree
- * A number of traffic calming issues and resolutions were made - see the website for more details
- * Allotments were once again discussed
- * The application for Playbuilder grant scheme was unsuccessful but the PC aren't giving up. More consultation is imminent with the village
- * The street lighting at the new development on Aldbourne Road - now to be known as Newton's Walk, was discussed
- * A number of financial issues were chewed over

Bike Rides from Baydon

A new addition to Scene with oodles of thanks to Niall Cooling

Ride 02

Uffingham Castle Loop

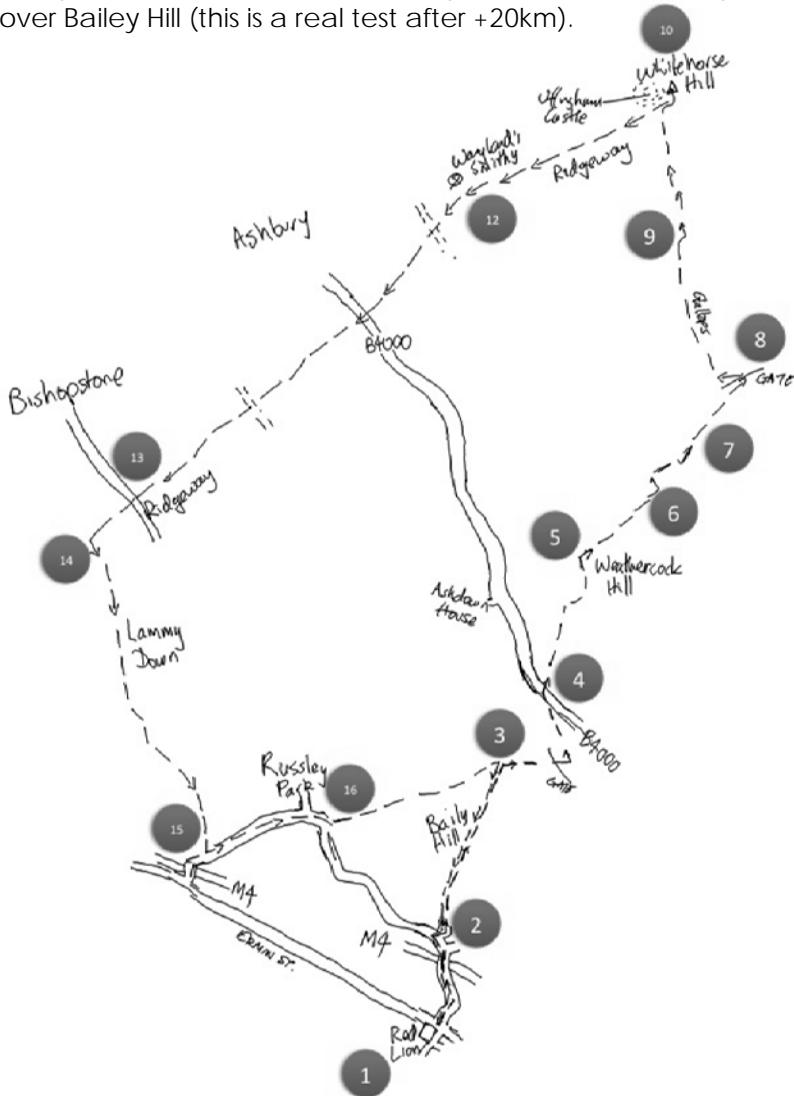
Distance: 26Km

Time: 1:30-2:00

This is probably my favourite Sunday morning/Summer evening ride. It has a number of really good climbs and downhill, with wonderful scenery.

- ⌚ Start from the green in Baydon heading out towards Russley Park.
- ⌚ Once over the motorway bridge take the 2nd right, down past Bailey Hill Farm and climb up over Bailey Hill.
- ⌚ At the bottom of Bailey Hill turn right and head along the bridleway until you pass through some gates (typically left open).
- ⌚ Here take the bridleway immediately left; this will bring you down to the B4000. Cross the road and head up the hill with Weathercock Hill on your left (you should be able to spot the weathercock on the hill-top).
- ⌚ Follow the track around until you reach a flagpole (often the Union flag is flying here). Head down the track, but be careful as it's fast but very rutted at the bottom.
- ⌚ Continue straight on crossing another bridleway and follow the track around skirting a small copse of trees on your left.
- ⌚ Climb the hill up to the gallops (this is a long, slow climb that is harder than it looks).
- ⌚ At the top you will come to a gate on you left. Go through the gate and skirt the left hand side of the field as the gallops run up the centre of this field.
- ⌚ At the top of the field pass through another gate and follow this track all the way up to the Ridgeway.
- ⌚ Once you hit the Ridgeway it is worth a quick detour to Uffingham Castle as on a clear day the views are magnificent.
- ⌚ Head down the Ridgeway away from Uffingham Castle towards Wayland's Smithy (take another quick detour if you've not visited it before).
- ⌚ At this part of the Ridgeway there is a small wood running on your left. It's worth diving off the Ridgeway as there is a really nice track running through the two woods.
- ⌚ There is now a nice long section on the Ridgeway, crossing the B4000 again. Continue on the Ridgeway until you've crossed the road (more of a track) that would take you down to Bishopstone.

- ⌘ Once you've crossed the Bishopstone road after about another 3km you'll be looking for a bridleyway off to the left that'll take you over Lammy Down. (Don't worry if you miss it as you'll end up at Fox Hill and is another good bridleyway back)
- ⌘ Follow the bridleyway over Lammy Down and you'll eventually pick up the road to Russley Park.
- ⌘ Take a left and follow the road past Russley until the sharp bend.
- ⌘ Here you've got two choices, the easy option – the road back to Baydon, or the harder option, head straight on along the Bridleyway until you reach the bottom of Bailey Hill and return to Baydon back over Bailey Hill (this is a real test after +20km).

Flu & Swine Flu Vaccines

They have arrived! Now is the time to contact the surgery for your seasonal flu vaccine.

If you fall into any of the below groups you are entitled to a **seasonal** flu vaccine:

Aged 65 or Over

This year the grape harvest had a very good year, in fact it was the best harvest in 62 years, so my nanna and grandad are going to enjoy their wine.



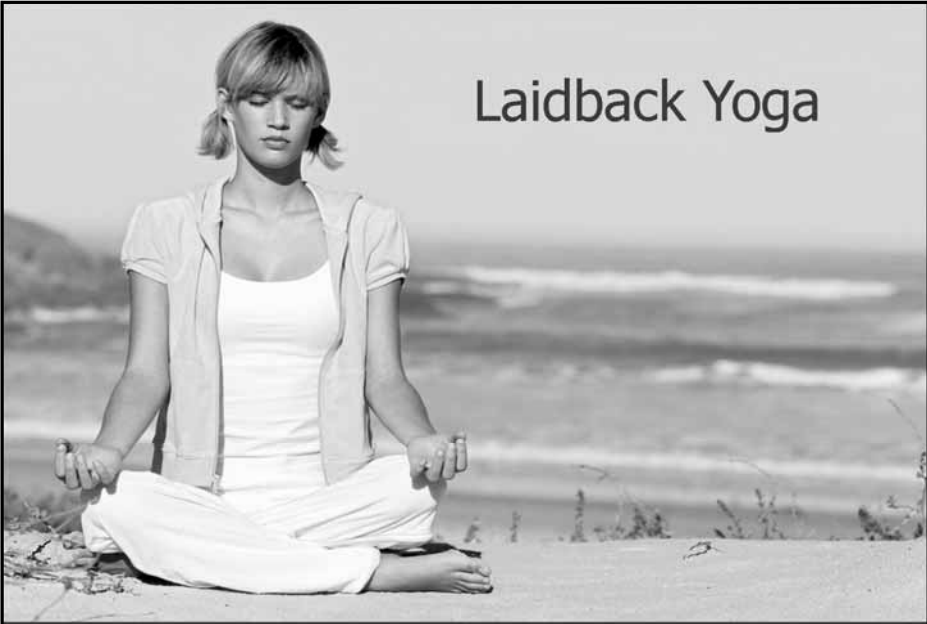
Château de Bannes - As Megan says - fairytale

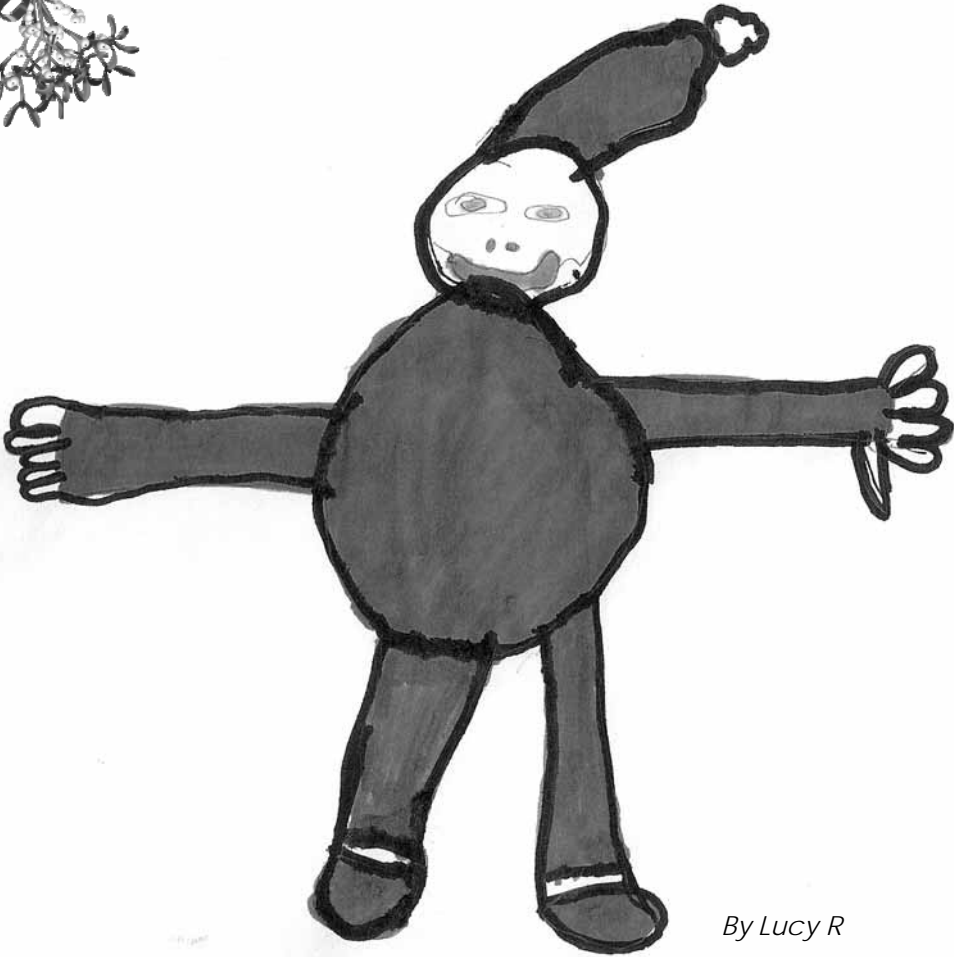
