

## Clergy letter...

It is the holiday season – a chance to get time out, a change from the common round of activities. I wonder if you will take the chance to visit or worship in a church in your holiday location. Many people do, and they find it an interesting experience. It can be refreshing - seeing things in a different way.



In my personal experience, whenever I have visited a new church, whether on holiday or because I

have moved into a new area, I have always found a welcome. Church is the one place where everyone should be welcomed – no matter who they are, or how they look! I trust this is true of our churches in the Whitton Team.

On September 27th 2009, half a million people will be inviting someone special to come to church with them on "Back to Church" Sunday. Why? Because, they personally know that being part of a worshipping church community which seeks to learn more about God, is meaningful and helpful. Consequently they want to extend the invitation to others. Watch out for the media coverage and ask yourself if you could invite someone or would appreciate an invitation.

Last year in Colchester Celia went to church on back to church Sunday: "I was surprised when I got to the church that morning. It was different to what I'd imagined, and the people were very friendly. I didn't feel like they were trying to shove religion down my throat, they let me make up my own mind. It was a very relaxed and welcoming atmosphere, just like one big family. I would recommend it to others: you never know where it could lead you. My whole life has changed completely in the last year."

If you don't go to church and would like to know more about the Christian faith, then we warmly invite you to our services on "Back to Church Sunday". But, please be assured that you are welcome on **any** Sunday... on the same basis – no strings attached! You are most welcome to come along and just see who we are, what we do..... and to ask us why we do it!

## French Twinning

A possible twinning project is being explored to link our Whitton Benefice with a parish in the Roman Catholic diocese of Evreux in Normandy. The Salisbury diocese is twinned with Evreux and a number of parishes, mostly in Dorset, have links with communities over there. The parish of Notre Dame des Bois consists of sixteen quite small communes with a total population of 10,000 and lies between Rouen and Evreux in rolling countryside. There is a lot of agriculture,


some industry and a good deal of commuting to nearby centres and to Paris – pretty much like our neighbourhood. Peter Ball has been to visit the parish priest there to open negotiations, and a group of about four people hope to come across for the September 13<sup>th</sup> weekend to join in our celebrations of the



1100th anniversary of the first Bishop of Ramsbury. What we need now is a small group representing the different parishes in our team to move things forward. A certain ability to converse in French is a help, as is an interest in learning more about our Christian neighbours across the Channel. # 'Building for the future'


Baydon St Nicholas School needs to raise around £50,000 to contribute towards the planned improvements.

So, lots of visits, lots of tokens.







# And now for something really scrumptious!..

Just a simple but delicious recipe that editor uses a lot as a starter or snack because she likes to cheat and spend more time chatting than cooking (hard to believe)! No idea where I pinched it from but it's really worth a go...Our kids call it:

# Pot of Gold (Baked Brie)

You'll need: A 300g brie Olive oil Salt Pepper Two sprigs of thyme A few pecan nuts A little runny honey



- Heat the oven to 200 ° C/Fan 180 ° C/Gas Mark 6
- Remove the box and any wrapping from the brie
- Put the brie in an oven proof dish and make a few cuts in the top
- Drizzle it with olive oil and season with salt, pepper and the thyme
- Cover with foil and pop into the oven to bake for around 10 minutes - it might take longer depending on how cold it is, how ripe etc- until it goes gooey in the middle
- Sprinkle with pecans, drizzle with honey and serve with some warm crusty bread or (if you're feeling healthy) apple slices to dunk

## Crofton Pumps up the Action

The volunteers at Crofton pumping station had to swing into action over the first weekend of July to save the canal from drying up after the main electric pump failed. The volunteers rallied around to get the 200 year old steam-fired engines going following a call from British Waterways on the Friday pm.

The modern electric pump near Crofton, which provides water for the highest point of the canal, failed, leaving dozens of boaters unable to use the canal. British Waterways closed the canal as a preventative measure on the Friday & Saturday afternoon. The station which operated on the Saturday, Sunday and Tuesday pumped more than 1.5 million gallons of water a day and consumed about 4 ½ tonnes of coal ensuring that the trapped boaters could continue on their journey.

The engines returned to their normal operating schedule on the 9<sup>th</sup> July with the next in-steam weekend being the 1<sup>st</sup> and 2<sup>nd</sup> of August.

As an added attraction to the end of August Steaming (29<sup>th</sup>, 30<sup>th</sup> & 31<sup>st</sup>) Crofton will be hosting a **Vegetable and Flower show**. Also on the Sunday 30<sup>th</sup> a Dakota from the Royal Air Force Battle of Britain Memorial Flight will be flying over Crofton Pumping Station; time to be advised.

### The Giant Sleepover - Wilton Windmill

Thirteen adventurous members of Great Bedwyn Cub Group bravely ignored rumours of hauntings and strange happenings "up at t'mill" to take part in The Giant Sleepover 2009 in aid of the Save The Children Fund. 


