From the Minister...

The festival of Pentecost (also known as Whitsun), which we celebrated towards the end of May, reminds us of the coming of God's Spirit, turning a huddle of terrified men and women, hiding behind



locked doors after Jesus' crucifixion, into people who seemed to be afraid of nothing, as they bore witness to the truth they had encountered: to the impact that the risen Jesus had had on their lives, and the strength that he could give them if they trusted him.

The following Sunday was "Trinity Sunday". Why's "Trinity" so important? It's reminding us of something really fundamental – the three different ways that Christians believe that we can encounter God. First, there's the belief that behind our wonderful universe, with all its complexity and frailty, with its beauty and intricacy and splendour and science and mathematics and music, there is a God, loving and creative, who cares about his world and the creatures that live in it, and who longs for them to respond by being loving and creative in return.

But because all that might seem too enormous, too far away and impersonal, at the right point in history God came to show us in human terms, in the way Jesus lived and died and rose again, what that means for the way we should try to live. Jesus also demonstrated in practice that God's love is limitless and generous, and that absolutely *nothing* can come between us and our Heavenly Father – unless we purposely choose to let it.

And so, thirdly – even today – God continues to work through human beings, helping them to be kinder, more loving, braver – whatever is needed, though the ups and downs of life – if they ask for his help in trying to make the world the kind of place he longs for it to be.

A Flyer in Flanders

Flanders, the spiritual home of cycling is an iconic destination for cyclists. The famous Spring Classics races around Oudenaarde are notorious for the unpredictable Flandrian weather and the cobbles.

The cobbles are not the genteel things found in the UK but big agricultural chunks of granite with sizeable gaps between them. Cycling over them is very hard, especially on the famous climbs.

The Flyers, Baydon's very own cycling club, decided to take on that challenge and Thursday saw five flyers jammed into a car laden with five bikes heading to Belgium.



On Friday morning The Flyers set off on the first day's 110km into Flandrian weather. After more or less managing the Pattenberg and then the Koppenberg, both cobbled and up to 22%, a café stop was well earned.

The way back required a cobbled descent of a kilometre or so. The climb up had been hard but the vibration at downhill speed was enough to cause RSI and concussion!

A visit to the cycling museum was in order followed by self medication with Belgian beer to offset the effects of the shaking.



The Saturday ride included the Iconic Muur van Geraardsbergen (21%). Muur means wall! However we made it to the top for a team picture next to the famous chapel.

Saturday's celebration dinner was excellent Belgian Blue steak.

Sunday saw a brief ride to recap some of the nearby climbs and then it was back to Blighty for five Baydon Flyers with tired legs!

As part of the BBC's World War I at home series last year, an article was broadcast radio about the Remount Depot at Russley Park.

Around a million horses were bought by Britain for military use during WW1. To supply that number, horses had to be brought to the UK to supplement what could be found here.

In any transport system involving animals, steps have to be taken to care for them, and make them ready for the next leg of their journey. Or, equally, injured horses would need treatment and care before being returned to the front. That's where Remount Depots come in. The term, 'Remount', comes from the perspective of the eventual rider for the horse. The would be a 'remount' for the new rider.

In Wiltshire, the all-female depot at Russley Park near Baydon, played a vital role in supplying horses for the front. "Russley Park is an unusual example", according to Dr Graham Winton who's researched the use of horses during WW1. "It was used really for the rehabilita officers' horses, around a hundred of them. The horses here would have been very fine animals indeed."

The fact that it was run by a staff of women was something of a jaw-dropper to Edwardian sensibilities and worth a report by the Times newspaper in December 1915. The articl that the women were all from nearby Hunts and were "ladies with a practical knowle horses", who could "turn that knowledge to good account".



"Cheaper by the Dozen" by Frank B. Gilbreth, Jr. and Ernestine Gilbreth Carey.



Frank B. Gilbreth, Jr. and Ernestine Gilbreth Carey recount their childhood, growing up in a family of twelve children, headed by parents Lillian Moller Gilbreth and Frank Bunker Gilbreth. You might suppose that such a family would have to be either chaotic and stressful, or run with rigid military discipline, but the Gilbreths seem to have managed it all with (mostly) calm competence and good humour. Can you imagine taking seven children on a cross-country train trip lasting several days? The children seem to have grown up well-balanced, fun, responsible, loving, intelligent and capable, with space to

develop themselves as well as having clear boundaries, goals and expectations regarding their behaviour and their contributions to the family.

Frank and Lillian Gilbreth were pioneers in the field of motion study and efficiency. When Frank died at 56, Lillian took on the mantle. They were also very keen on educating their children, not only to advance them in subjects taught at school but in more wide-ranging skills. Maths games at the dinner table resulted in the three-year-old knowing his 17 times table by overhearing what the others were doing. One summer, the Morse alphabet was painted all over the house, along with mnemonics to help learn it and "secret" messages leading the decoder to find some little prize. A "family council" discussed issues and a "purchasing committee" decided what to buy and found the best deal. Shirts are faster buttoned bottom to top than the other way around.

I found the book enjoyable and thought-provoking.






The Baydon Church and School Fete will be on Saturday 13 June 2015 from 1pm.
