Baydon St Nicholas Primary School has a very active governing body made up of members of stal clergy, members of the Church community and parents. A governor's term of office lasts 4 years and most are recruited through word of mouth and/or recommendation and each has a different set or skills and experiences that make up a well-rounded Governing committee.

Due to the natural turnover of office, we are currently looking to recruit 3 Foundation Governors who are appointed by the Church authorities and have a specific responsibility in terms of monitoring and developing the Christian distinctiveness of our Church school. - the confidence to ask questions and debate answers;

The Governing Body of our school plays a key role in:-

- deciding policy and future development plans;
- setting targets and raising educational standards;

- supporting and challenging the Headteacher and therefore the performance of the staff and the school as a whole.

Our Governing Body works together as a team and sometimes the whole governing body is involved. There are six Full Governing Body (FGB) meetings a year. At other times we work in teams on various committees, looking at specific areas of the school in more detail, i.e. Finance, Buildings, Worship Health & Safety and Teaching & Learning. The committees meet regularly and report back to the FGB. Some governors have specific responsibilities such as Policies, Early Years and Special Education Needs.

- The opportunity to work with our team of governors and staff in improving our school;
- A sense of achievement in making a difference to our school;
- The pleasure of helping our children reach their potential.

Being a governor can be enjoyable, stimulating and rewarding. Please don't be put off by thinking that you have to have specialist expertise or knowledge. Enthusiasm and interest is much mor important to start with and there is tried and tested training and support available to help you throughout your term. And remember, you will be joining a long established governing body and will be supported by fellow governors with many combined years of experience.

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# **Chief Constable's Monthly Column**

Recently I had the pleasure of attending the launch event of a new service aimed at protecting vulnerable people in the local community from the growing threat of cybercrime. It is a very real threat, which knows no geographical boundaries, and it is one we must all be wary of.

Thanks to the incredible work of the Wiltshire Bobby Van Trust and its dedicated and remarkable group of volunteers, we now have an advisory service that will help people stay safe.

For those in our community who are over 60 or over 18 and registered disabled, they will be able to request a visit from one of the newly trained Online Safety Volunteers. Working alongside Wiltshire Police, the Bobby Van will deliver this wonderful new initiative across Swindon and Wiltshire.

As one of the fastest growing crimes targeting people over 60 it is really good to see these community minded volunteers stepping forward to help prevent crime by giving up their time to help others improve their security.

The Wiltshire Bobby Van Trust itself is a fantastic service and has been securing homes for almost 20 years now. Working alongside the police and the fire service, they do a remarkable job in not only making homes safer for vulnerable people in our communities, but also in restoring confidence and sense of safety that everybody in our communities should have. I cannot overstate how important that is and I am incredibly proud to be associated with such a brilliant charity.

I am pleased to see this charity respond to changing needs and I really believe it will make a positive difference. I hope that the people this scheme is aimed at take the opportunity to use it and make the most of the fantastic work that has gone into this.

As well as people over 60 and adults who are registered disabled, the Bobby Van also does a lot of work to help victims of domestic violence, which is the fastest growing area of the charity's work.

Domestic Abuse can affect many people's lives and comes in many forms. One in four women and one in six men are affected by it. Reducing the number of incidents and supporting victims is another incredibly important area of the Bobby Van's work.

The charity also installs covert cameras and manages around 60 of them in some of the most vulnerable homes in the county. Their work in this area has helped Wiltshire Police secure convictions and, perhaps most importantly, has given many people peace of mind.

I would like to publicly express my personal gratitude for the work of the Wiltshire Bobby Van Trust, its operators and its volunteers, they do a really incredible job.

I was recently very pleased to see one of our own Detective Constables, Michael O'Sullivan run the London Marathon in aid of the Bobby Van. He put in an incredible effort and raised over £2,000 online for the charity in the process.

I'm not suggesting you get your trainers on and run 26 miles, but the Bobby Van is a charity and does rely on the generosity of the public. I would encourage anybody who felt like supporting this great cause to do so, it really does make a huge difference to so many different people across Swindon and Wiltshire.

The Life-Changing Magic of Tidying, by Marie Kondo

# What is a Parish Council?

A parish council is a local authority that makes decisions on behalf of the people in the parish. It is the level of government closest to the community, with the district authority, Wiltshire Council, above it in the hierarchy.

Parish councils make all kinds of decisions on issues that affect the local community. Probably the most common topics that parish councils get involved with are planning matters (they are statutory consultees), traffic calming, crime prevention, managing open spaces/village greens, playgrounds and allotments. They campaign for, deliver and maintain better services, facilities and activities, including village events, footpaths, leisure and sports facilities, youth projects, litter bins, signage and lighting amongst many other things.

Councils usually meet once a month for the council meeting, to which members of the public are also invited to listen, with limited amount of time for public questions. Meetings may last two or three hours, depending on the agenda. In addition to the regular meetings, councillors are required to attend other meetings representing the council. For example acting as a representative on an outside body, community activities or helping develop a new project for the community.

Their activities fall into three main categories: representing the local community, delivering services to meet local needs, and improving quality of life and community well-being.

Parish councils are funded by levying a "precept" collected with the council tax paid by the residents of the parish. Parish councils have unpaid councillors who are elected to serve for four years, unless a casual vacancy arises which may be filled by a by-election or by Cooption of Competence to eligible local councils.

The administration of the Council is managed by the Parish Clerk, who is the only paid employee acting in a combined statutory role as secretary and Responsible Financial Officer of the council. This role is part-time.

The necessary financial monitoring and reporting are the clerk's responsibility, and in this role the clerk is known as the "Responsible Financial Officer" (RFO) of the Council. The clerk is also the "Proper Officer" of the Council. They "enact" (cause to happen) the decisions of the Council, and they receive official correspondence and issue correspondence on the instructions of the Council. The clerk also prepares agendas for meetings of the Council and its committees, gives notice of these to the Council members and the public, and records and publishes the minutes of these meetings. They are the formal point of contact with the public, and are a source of information for the public about the Council's activities.

The clerk also provides procedural guidance for the Council itself, and ensures that statutory and other provisions governing or affecting the running of the Council are observed. *(Extracts from Wiltshire Council Website and Wikipedia).*

# Update from



We would like to start by thanking everyone for their continued support and for your interest in saving the Baydon Lion.

You will be pleased to hear that we have received sufficient pledges to enable us to continue our objective of acquiring the Red Lion as a Community Pub.

We know that many of you have been waiting to see our Business Plan and it is hoped that we will be in a position to distribute this in early June. We were unable to put the finishing touches to this as we were waiting for an independent valuation of the Red Lion premises - this has now taken place.

Additionally, we have submitted an application to HMRC requesting that The Red Lion Community Pub Ltd be approved as being eligible for The Enterprise Investment Scheme (EIS). The Scheme is designed to help smaller companies raise finance by offering a range of tax reliefs to investors who purchase new shares in these companies.

Should the EIS be granted we anticipate that the available tax relief will be an added incentive for villagers and outside investors to purchase shares.

Now, more than ever, we need your requests for shares and your pledges. To ensure that we can acquire the Red Lion and made it a successful Community Pub, it is imperative that as many of you as possible buy shares in the Red Lion Community Pub Ltd. This will mean that all of us are committed to making the pub what the village wants it to be, not just for us but for the next generation.

We have a deadline (7th Oct 2017) by which to put together a bid to purchase the Red Lion. In order to start the process of submitting our bid we need to have the money in the bank by 1st July 2017, otherwise we will be unable to proceed.
