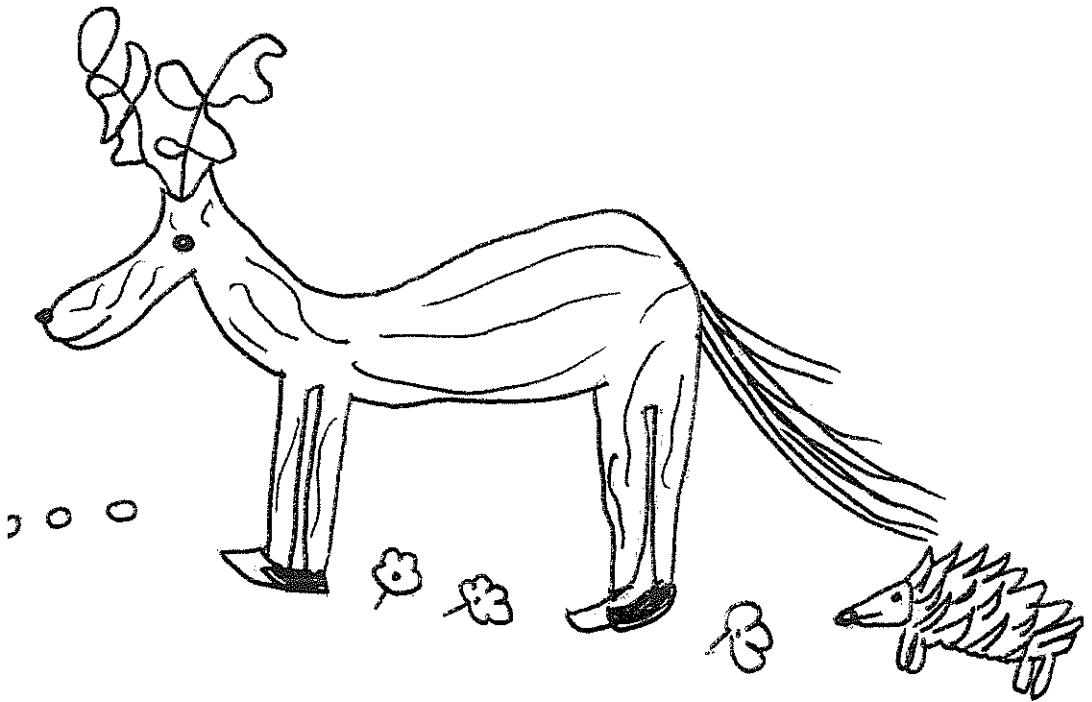



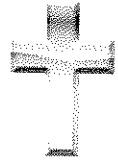

Clergy Letter..



Dear Friends,

You've almost certainly heard by now that Sandy and I made the announcement at the Team Service in Chilton Foliat on 31st August that we had resigned from our appointments here as Team Vicar and Team Rector respectively. We will be retiring at the end of October and moving out of the Rectory during November and into our own home in Wroughton, not a million miles away. I can't even begin to describe how hard it was to make that decision. The catalyst, of course, is that Sandy has been quite ill now for about ten months and, while she's received excellent care from the specialists at the Brompton hospital, it's now clear that she won't be able to work full-time again. Common sense dictated that I couldn't go on indefinitely trying to do both our jobs! There are other factors too – including the growing frustration I've been feeling with ecclesiastical bureaucracy and the increasingly over-regulated church culture, which effectively hinder us in doing what we believe we were Ordained to do! All of which led us to the conclusion that the right thing for us to do was to retire.

We shall be very sad to leave our work here, but nothing will ever detract from the joy and the sense of fulfilment we've experienced here in the parishes of the Whitton Benefice. We love these communities and their people, and we're just so grateful for the love and support we've received from our churchwardens, PCC members, congregations and the wider communities. We're going to miss you all just SO much, but we have many, many friends here, so I'm sure we'll keep coming back!

Our last service will be on Sunday 26th October at 11.00 am at Holy Cross Church in Ramsbury. There'll be drinks and nibbles for everyone in the Memorial Hall after the service, followed by a 'Bring-and-Share' lunch for those who want to stay on.

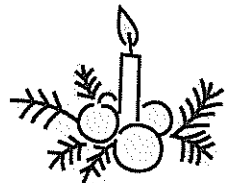

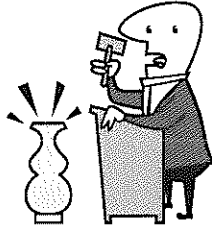

- As in previous years **NO** vehicles will be allowed onto the cricket field.

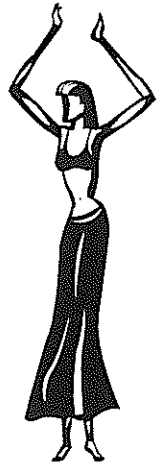

Baydon WI News

At the August meeting WI members and visitors enjoyed an evening of Egyptian Dancing performed by Negoum El Levl (Stars of the Night).

The group's principal, Loreley Rice gave a brief talk about Egyptian Dancing, more commonly known as Belly Dancing, after which her student group demonstrated a number of dances.

Following the performance WI members were invited to join the students and attempt the intricate dancing. Even the male visitor responded and a great time was had by all.



15 members enjoyed an informative and enlightening talk by Mr Andrew Davies entitled Waitrose and the Community, at the meeting on Thursday 11th September.

Mr Davies, part of the management team at the Marlborough store outlined the history of the John Lewis Partnership which began in London during 1864. In 1909, he added, a unique co-ownership was set up and is still in existence today. The company has no external shareholders.

The store in Marlborough opened 31 years ago and prides itself on resourcing very local food products wherever possible. Mr Davies also said that the store gives 1% of all profits to local charities - at present three charities a month and the customers have a chance to influence how much is given to each one.

Mr Davies left a large Waitrose hamper for the members to share.

And now for something really scrumptious!..

We know that the WI play a unique role in providing women with educational opportunities and the chance to build new skills, to take part in a wide variety of activities and to campaign on issues that matter to them and their communities. But we also know that many members are great cooks!

The Baydon WI have very kindly offered to provide Scene with recipes each edition. The first comes from Angela Heather. Editor has tested this (in the best tradition of conscientious editing!) and it's scrumptious with a lovely freshly baked roll and it freezes really well.

Carrot, Honey & Ginger Soup

Serves 6

2 tbsp olive oil

150g onion, thinly sliced

20g fresh root ginger, peeled & grated

600g carrots, peeled & grated

1 tablespoon clear honey

1 tbsp lemon juice

1 teaspoon salt

5 turns freshly ground pepper

900ml boiling water

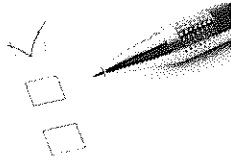


- Heat the olive oil in a large saucepan
- Add the onions and stir well to coat—don't let the onions go brown
- Add the ginger and sweat for 10 minutes
- Now add the grated carrots, honey, lemon juice and seasoning
- Stir well then pour in the boiling water and bring to the boil
- Simmer for 45 minutes
- You may have to add a little more boiling water during this time to allow for evaporation
- Remove the pan from the heat and liquidise the contents until smooth and creamy
- Check the seasoning and serve

If you're making the soup ahead and you want to freeze it, allow the soup to cool before pouring into a sealable tub and putting into the freezer

If you're not freezing it, the soup will keep well for up to three days

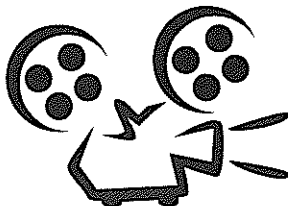

Where we focus on something, someone or a group of folk in the village

This month, Editor was attempting to drag her tired running legs around the village when, like a speeding bullet, Harriet Knowles overtook her, not once, but twice. Honestly!

Delving deeper, Harriet, who runs the Yoga and Aerobics classes in the village and lives on Fiveways with hubby and their two children Martha and Freddie, is training for the Abingdon Marathon taking place this month.

Editor decided to pin her down and ask her what on earth she's doing and why!:

Why did you decide to run a marathon?

I've been running for a few years just for fun and I decided to do a half marathon, did a couple more, then decided a full marathon might be worth a go!

How is the training going?

I was already running 3 times a week so an increase to 5 times a week didn't seem too bad, the training plan is over 18 weeks with the longest run before the actual race being 22 miles.

Are you doing anything else?

Being a yoga and an aerobic instructor means I teach classes or practise yoga daily which helps keep me strong and flexible, and maintains a nice counter balance to the running. Also as yoga strengthens and develops the mind as well as the body it helps with the mental strength required to run long distances.

Are you running for charity?

I'm running the race with my sister, a personal trainer, so we are asking for sponsorship for Newbury and District Cancer Care Trust. It supports the rainbow room in Newbury Hospital where our granddad recently passed away. If you wanted to sponsor me please go to www.justgiving.com/emmajaynebailey.

What would you say to anyone that wanted to take up running?

Go for it! Take it easy to start with, so maybe only run for 5 minutes and then build carefully from there. Set yourself a goal 5k/10k/ half marathon and then train as hard as you can. If you can, find yourself a running partner to help with the motivation. Who knows you may become hooked.

Abingdon, Sunday 19th October, supposedly nice and flat!

OBITUARY

Diana Ellen Cowles (nee Hunt)
28th April 1929 - 1st September 2008



Diana was born in Westfield Farm, Finches Lane, Baydon (where her daughter lives now) and was one of five children. She attended St. Nicholas Church regularly and was a Sunday school teacher there for many years.

Diana met Clifford, an Aldbourne man, when she was 19 years of age, when they both attended Old Time Dancing lessons at the Aldbourne Memorial hall. At this time Diana was the post lady for Baydon and delivered the mail around the village on her bicycle before returning home to help her mother and brothers Henry and Bill on the farm.

On August 27th 1955 Diana and Clifford were married. After renting the Old Vicarage for eleven months they finally moved into Tubbs Farm where they lived for the next 52 years.

Diana continued to work in the community during her married life including making the teas for the Thursday Club in the school hall.

In 1970 Diana began working at the Thames Valley Egg Packing Station, firstly in Aldbourne and then at Membury until she retired at the age of 60.

"Diana was a loving mother to daughters Julie and Sarah" said Clifford, "and mother in law to Shane Dent and Paul Rolf". She doted on her four grandchildren Katherine, Alice, Jessica and Ryan, he added.

There was standing room only at the funeral service on Tuesday 9th September 2008 in St. Nicholas Church, Baydon.

Tributes to Diana by way of donations in excess of £500 have been received and will be given to the Lambourn Surgery.

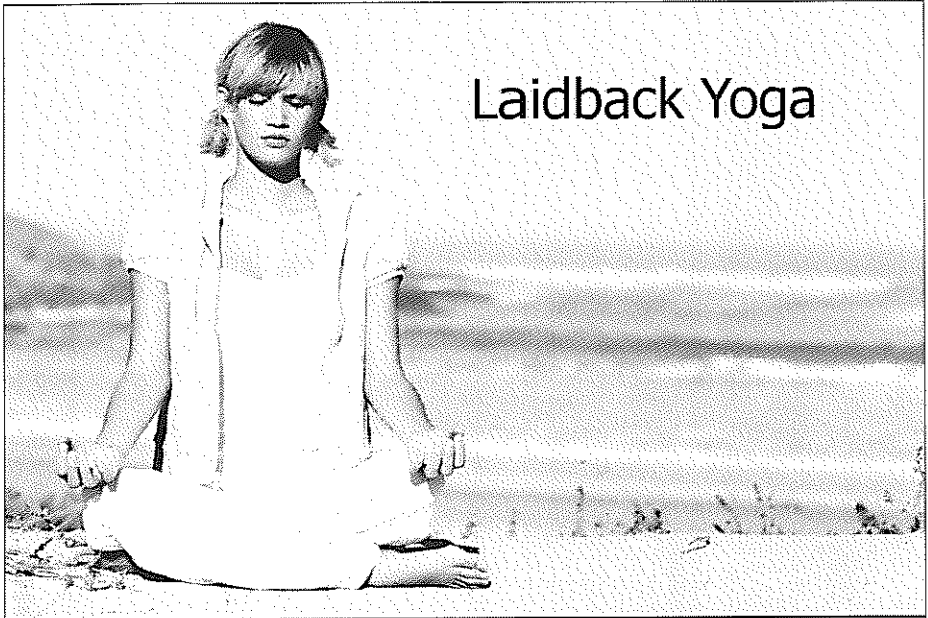
