Assisi in 2012

Following last year's successful pilgrimage to Romania, Peter Ball (A Companion of the Anglican Society of St. Francis for over sixty years) returns to Italy next year to lead another week in Assisi, June 21st – 27th.



The trip offers many different experiences echoing the life of St. Francis and his first brothers. We stay at the comfortable, welcoming St Anthony's Guesthouse run by the American Sisters of the Atonement, a few minutes walk from the Piazza del Commune and overlooking the Basilica of St. Clare.

Basilica of St. Clare

The pilgrimage takes us on a walking tour of the town and visits by coach or taxi to many of the places connected with Francis and Clare in the countryside around. Near the town are San Damiano where Francis first heard the call to "rebuild the church" and his place of retreat in the woods at I Carceri.

One day is spent on a trip to Laverna where he received the stigmata, the marks of the crucified Christ and San Sepulchro where we see the great Resurrection picture painted by Piero della Francesca. Another day sees an outing to Lake Trasimene and the island where he spent time in retreat. Following Francis's journeying round the neighbourhood, we visit the lovely Rieti valley and Greccio, scene of the first Christmas Crib. There will be opportunities for worship together at some of the sites, as well as in the Guesthouse

chapel, and for times of reflection on the events of the day.



PC Meeting 5 September Overview of main points

- Tony Prior, current Chair, is resigning in December. No one has yet come forward as replacement
- Application for outline planning permission for the erection of four houses at Foxfield and Estcots, Aldbourne Road. The Cllrs listened to the comments of residents neighbouring the location and discussed the application. The Cllrs agreed that the village doesn't need any more development, particularly larger houses and that three bedroom properties are in short supply in Baydon. The Cllrs agreed to ask Cllr Humphries to 'Call-in' the planning application to Wiltshire Council
- Community Speed Watch is still continuing with an average of 25 cars being found speeding per hour. The Marlborough Board Issue to move the permanent SID in Ermin Street is still ongoing.





PLASTIC & CARDBOARD KERBSIDE RECYCLING

A Letter from Claire Perry MP

Government's Proposals for the National Planning Framework



I'm taking advantage of the current parliamentary recess to get on top of my letters and emails from constituents and as many of them relate to the Government's proposals to reform the National Planning Framework, I thought "Scene" readers would appreciate a bit more information. Like my fellow Wiltshire residents I love this green and rural county and do not want to see anything introduced that looks like a charter for developers.

But it is also the case that we have both a serious local housing shortage (especially of smaller, affordable homes) and huge developments, dumped down or filled in, with little thinking about the underlying infrastructure needed to create sustainable communities.

Many of these big-build projects have been refused initially by Wiltshire Council only for the developers to go straight to appeal, and win, using the plans set out by the Whitehall in the top-down Regional Spatial Strategies. Under these new proposals the Local Plan, developed only after input from towns and villages across Wiltshire will be sacrosanct. ANOBs, SSSIs and the Green Belt will remain protected and there will be new protections for the vital bits of greenery in our towns and villages like the Common in Marlborough or the Green in Baydon.

In anticipation of more questions I have put a Myth Busters document on my website, claire.perry.org.uk, but I would be extremely happy to hear from even more of you on this critical matter as I think it is so important to get it right.



New Plastic Bottle & Cardboard Recycling Service

Wiltshire Council is introducing a new plastic bottle & cardboard recycling collection service across the county from autumn.

The new plastic bottle & cardboard recycling collection service will start at the beginning of November 2011, with new blue-lidded bins being delivered to households throughout October.

Residents will receive a leaflet & collection calendar information through the post shortly before the bins are delivered, explaining how to use the service and when to put the blue lidded bin out for collection.

Slightly different arrangements have been made for residents who live in flats, and an assessment will be carried out on each individual block of flats to determine exact bin requirements. This is explained in more detail in the information being delivered through the post before the bins arrive.


"Accidental Empires: How the Boys of Silicon Valley Make Their Millions, Battle Foreign Competition, and Still Can't Get a Date", by Robert X. Cringely

Robert X. Cringely is the pen-name of one, or possibly more, columnist(s) in the magazine Info World. He describes with knowledge, humour, zest, not a little irony and with no awe whatever, the rises and falls, of men who became household names thanks to their parts in bringing the computer from being a massive beast filling rooms in government accounts departments, to something present on a table or even in a

pocket in practically every household. How did the likes of Steve Jobs and Bill Gates get started? A mix of vision, opportunity, ego, not knowing and therefore not following the received wisdom of how to run a business or commercialise an idea, contributed to bringing the tinkerings of a few computer enthusiasts into the homes of millions. Along the way, some got lost, some got bought out, and some good products were beaten by better marketing and tougher commercial deals.

Remember playing "tennis" in black and white on the TV? Loading programs by tape cassette? How far the technology has developed! It was also interesting to reflect on the more recent period that the book does not cover - the revised edition was published in 1996, and the author speculated at that time about future developments.

"Accidental Empires" is written in a very readable style, with plenty of anecdotes and incidents recounted, along with insightful analysis of events. The book spawned a TV documentary series, "Triumph of the Nerds".





It's not every day that history is made in our village but on the 1st June this year a small but not insignificant event occurred that should not pass un-noticed because it affects everybody in our community and will do for evermore. What I am alluding to is an 80 meter length of footpath that connects the front of Baydon House to the southern end of the alternative path around the house. From the above date this short footpath ceased to be public right of way so there is no longer a throughway past this house.



I am sure many residents in Baydon and particularly the newcomers to our village will say "So what there is an acceptable alternative path to this route," but the 'longer toothed' members of the community like myself remember the many decades we have walked that path. I think it is sad that our children now no longer have the freedom

to walk along this small part of our village where previous generations had for hundreds or possibly a thousand years previously.

The answer is clear. When the application was made to close the path only two residents from our village bothered to submit written objections, so it is not surprising that the Planning Inspectorate ruled in favour of the application.

So come on Residents of Baydon, let us make sure that if a land owner again attempts to close or divert our public rights of way, we stand up to fight and voice our dissatisfaction. Let us not see our local heritage be whittled away in this manner again.

Organ Donation - the right thing to do

My baby niece Lottie Bryon-Edmond (AKA 'Chip') was born on 6 July with an incurable liver disease - neonatal haemochromatosis - which meant her only chance of survival was a liver transplant.

I was already a donor but hadn't given it much thought until the moment we were told by the consultants that only 10 paediatric livers become available each year so hundreds of children die waiting for that phone call.

And it isn't just children who die waiting for donated organs. Only 29% of the UK are registered donors but a recent poll suggested that over 94% of adults asked said



they would take an organ if they needed one. I'm not sure if this is hypocrisy or a failure on the part of the NHS to promote donor registration (or both)...

So my family started an awareness campaign - our aim - to get a million people to sign up (and importantly to then tell their nearest and dearest of their wishes). Chip BE Campaign is in full swing - we're planning a channel swim in 2013 with schools and swimming clubs involved and we're running a 'Lottie's Lifeline' appeal for donors in the papers. We're at Chipbe.com and on twitter @chipbeblog.

As far as Lottie was concerned, we ran a huge media campaign across the world (as it turned out) in the hope that a parent at the most awful moment in their lives, thought of helping Lottie or others like her. It worked. But even better, Lottie's new liver came from a living donor. It transpires that you can take as much as 40% of a liver and give it to another. The original liver and the donated part will both grow back to 100% over time.

So on 28 August, the day the consultants at Birmingham Children's Hospital had told my brother and sister-in-law that Lottie probably wouldn't survive beyond, she received a new liver. I can't explain to you what a relief it was receiving the phone call at 04:30 in the morning from my brother to tell me that Lottie had a chance of survival. We really had all started to feel that there was little hope. Many, many tears were shed.

She survived the operation and on 28 September Lottie came home to Torquay. She will be on immunosuppressant drugs for many moons but she's alive. And she wouldn't have been if it weren't for the gorgeous, gorgeous parents who allowed their child to donate part of their liver to our baby and give her life. I know it's not a nice thing to think about but there are thousands and thousands of people out there waiting for that phone call. Most of them won't receive it because of the shortage of organs.

Please go onto the organ donation website - www.uktransplant.org.uk and sign up. You can decide which organs you're happy to donate. And please say ChipBE sent you.

Thank you for saving someone's life.
