From the Minister...

Harvest Festival is celebrated in our churches at this time of year. We live in beautiful countryside, and have watched the changing colour of the fields throughout the year - the green of new growth, the yellow of oil seed rape, the golden barley fields. It is



timely to give thanks for all we have – including our local communities. Harvest comes in many other forms as well – a good exam result, a new life skill learned, a baby in the family, new friendships forged, acts of kindness received. What "harvest" would you celebrate in your life this year?

This situation may well be deeply unsettling, but as we recollect all we have, let us ask God for a harvest of compassion in our hearts, and a harvest of wisdom for the governments of Europe in determining the best way to manage this situation.





Local Road Closures

There are a number of local road closures to be aware of in October

Mop Fairs

The annuals mop fairs in Marlborough will lead to the following closures:

Little Mop · the High Street will be closed at Midday on Friday 3 October and reopened at 8am on Sunday 5 October 2014.

Big Mop – the High Street will be closed at Midday on Friday 17 October and reopened at 8am on Sunday 19 October 2014.

Roads closed:

- A4 High Street; from its junction with Pewsey Road in a northerly direction to junction with Kingsbury Stre
- Kingsbury Street (Part); from its junction with High Street in a nc -westerly direction to its junction with Silverless Str
- New Road; from its junction with High Street in an easterly direction to its ju with London Road.

No Parking cones will be placed out on Pewsey Road and George Lane to coincide with the High Street closure – this measure is to allow the free movement of diverted traffic.

Downsmead resurfacing

The much needed re-surfacing of Downsmead takes place in October and the planned start date is 20 October 2015. It is anticipated that the closure will be required until October 2015. Access will be maintained for residents.

Aldbourne roadworks

There are significant road works in Aldbourne in October

- 13-19 Oct Oxford Street closed from Lottage road to the A41
- 20-28 Oct Lottage road close

Closures are well signed on the roads in Aldbourne, keep an eye out!



Message from Baydon Parish Councillors

We have two long standing vacancies for Councillors. Also as you know we do not have a Clerk.

We do understand that we cannot run as efficiently as we would like because we do not have a full complement of seven. We have members with full time jobs, plus associated commuting time, and only one retired member. On the positive side, and in spite of various setbacks, we feel we have achieved quite substantial projects as originally set out in the Village Plan 2009.

We think there should be a balance between working and retired Councillors so that some of the day time duties can be carried out by the latter, enabling our Parish Council to function with standards that residents expect.

With experience from the recent past, the alternative could be to pay outside resources to carry out some of the Council agenda items. Setting up and managing work, in itself, needs organising and sometimes attendance during working hours. If this became established it may possibly lead to an increase in the Precept. The Precept is the only legal duty we have now and that does not require the existence of an independent Parish Council to set it.

An option regarding the Clerk vacancy could be to employ a locum Clerk i.e. someone from outside the village.


In these days of continual changes to employment opportunities and practices we could slide towards a quorum or below. Retired members can help to counteract this potential problem.

In view of all the above we are appealing to retired residents to think about your village situation and hopefully be persuaded to join us on the Council. We can meet anyone on a one-to-one or group basis to discuss any queries etc. Please give it some thought.


Baydon Church featured on Sunday morning BBC Wiltshire radio programme







Review of Robert Smail's Printing Works

I still haven't finished the book, so here is another non-book review! I appreciate that Scotland is not on your doorstep, but some of you venture far and wide; if you are ever in the vicinity of Innerleithen (between Peebles and Galashiels) Robert Smail's Printing



Works it is well worth a visit. Dad and I had a fun and interesting time there. The 19th century print works still operates commercially using the original machines. The original shop holds records of all the printed material ever produced by the print works – the Smails never threw anything away. Then –those of you who know Dad or me will appreciate that we enjoyed this bit – demonstrations in the print shop. Victorian engineering really is poetry in motion. All the timing for the different action: – inking the roller, transferring the ink to the platen, picking up and placing the paper, the printing – is governed by mechanics. There is no electronic timing at all, of course

Upstairs, we set our own line of type and printed a bookmark. Type looks back to front when set – hence the apprentice had to "mind his p's and q's" when putting letters back in their boxes. From the setting room come also the terms "uppe case" and "lower case" – capital letters were kept in the sectioned case sat above the case holding the small letter:

Have you ever wondered how lines are put on lined paper? Or the grids in an account book? Find out at Smail's Print Works!
