As the academic year draws to a close, I reflect on the wonderful year that we have had. The children have had good academic results again this year putting the school above national and Wiltshire averages across all subjects in our Foundation stage, phonics, KS1 and KS2. All the children pushed themselves to develop and grow from this experience and we congratulate them for throwing themselves into everything offered to them!

Our topic this term has been Africa and the children in Robins and Goldfinches had a very happy trip to Cotsworld Wildlife Park to view at first hand some African animals and develop their understanding of predators, prey and the different animal classifications.

At the end of term, the whole school sang, danced and acted their way to West End success with their production of The Little Mermaid. The production was a riot of colour with all the ingredients of great entertainment: brilliant acting, beautiful singing, great jokes and a wonderful love story. Well done to everyone for entertaining us so well.

The Ramsbury Flyer Community Bus

The Ramsbury 'Flyer' is run by volunteers within the village of Ramsbury and other local communities. It has been in existence since 1993. Ramsbury Community Transport, which operates The Flyer, became a registered charity in 2014. The 'Flyer' provides reasonably priced transport for all ages and is used by local clubs and societies as well as for regular scheduled services. On our scheduled shopping services, bus passes can be used.



The day to day costs of running the Flyer are paid for by the grants from local authorities, donations and revenue from private and community hire.

The aim of the Flyer is to provide affordable and convenient transport to the residents of Ramsbury and surrounding villages, complimenting other forms of public transport.

We have a number of regular services, which include:

- Transport to and from the Ramsbury Surgery Tuesday & Thursday mornings The Flyer visits local villages, including Ramsbury, Baydon, Aldbourne, Axford, Mildenhall, Froxfield and Chilton Foliat, picking up residents at a central place and taking them to and from the Ramsbury Surgery for their appointments. In order to use this free service, simply mention this to the Receptionist when booking your appointment at the Surgery.
- Scheduled service to Hungerford Wednesday & Friday mornings. See Flyer Scheduled Services Timetable on our website and displayed in bus shelters -Bus passes can be used

Wednesday: shopping trip to Hungerford, collecting from Ramsbury, Chilton Foliat and Froxfield.

Friday: shopping trip to Hungerford, collecting from Aldbourne, Ramsbury and Froxfield

- Scheduled service to Marlborough 1st and 3rd Wednesday of the month. See Flyer Scheduled Services Timetable on our website and displayed in bus shelters - Bus passes can be used
- **Newbury shopping Excursion 2nd Thursday each month.** Regular excursion into Newbury leaves the square in Ramsbury at 11.30am. You can be collected from Back Lane, Axford, Ramsbury High Street and Aldbourne this is not a scheduled service so bus passes cannot be accepted. The current fare £4.00. Please phone Janet on 01672 520682 to reserve your place

Reaction to the single car collision with the build out on Ermin Street Saturday 21 July

Opinions in Baydon may be divided regarding the solution, but actually all village residents are united in the view that speeding traffic is a big problem.

Understandably, villagers are very concerned about road safety, feel very passionate and have some very strong opinions about it. This has led some individuals to believe that they are better qualified than the Highways Engineers. (I would have to count myself in that group from time to time!)

Unfortunately, this has led to a split in the village, between those who think we are safer with the buildout in place and those who really don't. In a small village like ours, with some big personalities, this has resulted in some pretty ugly scenes in meetings and some rather unhelpful gossip.

What I'd like to highlight, is that all Baydon residents actually want the same thing. We want the drivers going through our village, to pay more care and attention. We want this because cars are hurtling along the main road which has our Primary School, pub and shop along it. Cars are also doing unsuitable speeds down our narrow, winding roads and parking in dangerous places. We want drivers to take more care, because we all know that it's only a matter of time before a pedestrian or cyclist is killed or seriously injured.

Baydon Parish Council actually started lobbying the County Council for speed reductions way back, in 1960. Villagers joined them in 1967, when 192 residents (which must have been everyone living here at the time!), signed a petition asking for speed reduction. Since then, we've been travelling on a long and bumpy road towards calming the traffic. Unfortunately, we are nowhere near the end of our journey.

Some of the aggression that has been directed at Baydon Parish Council is caused by people being unaware of all the restrictions that have to be worked within, including Highways regulations, budget limits and the very steady pace of local government. Most residents are also unaware of all the work that has been done over many years, to explore every other possible option, before installing the only traffic calming measures available. It is hard to accept that that there is no silver bullet and we need a number measures installed, over a number of years, working in collaboration.

In addition, it is human nature to take out our anger and frustration at those nearest to us. We are all unable to confront the careless commuters speeding by every day. Therefore, we are tempted to turn against our own, hard-working Parish Council, who volunteer their own time to improve village life, such as installing a playground and organising village events etc. We should resist doing this, not because the PC is faultless (it isn't), but because it is destructive and counter-productive to do so.

I think everyone would agree that Baydon's speeding problem cannot, and will not be solved by standing back and doing nothing. Baydon Parish Council have taken the only action they could take. I would now like to appeal to Wiltshire County Council and Wiltshire Police, to help Baydon, to get the traffic calming it urgently needs.

In Wiltshire, we are not allowed the traditional traffic cameras that result in points and fines, but a recent pilot of ANPR cameras in a nearby county, has been very successful. These cameras record the number plates of speeding cars and send the information to the police. The information can then be used by the police to write a warning letter to extreme or repeat offenders. During the pilot, these cameras reduced speeds by 33%.

No solution exists in the world that would make absolutely everyone happy, but hopefully the majority would support a scheme like this. It would be unobtrusive, would deter speeders from doing it again, but would not discourage drivers from using our local businesses. In fact, it would simply be an automated version of the Community Speedwatch that Baydon has run in the past and would ensure traffic negotiating the existing chicanes, is going slower. (Traditional speed cameras have already been requested several times in in the Public Question Time of Parish Council meetings.)

Finally, I would like anyone reading this, to consider how very different the newspaper articles and Facebook comments would have been, had the driver failed to safely negotiate around a cyclist in broad daylight, at the very same location on Saturday 21 July.

Aldbourne and Baydon Link Scheme.

The Link Scheme has been running since 2006 and we are sure anyone who has used it will agree that it is an excellent service and a great asset to our two villages. There are forty four similar schemes in Wiltshire.

Link is run by a committee of four, plus four coordinators and over thirty drivers. We are all volunteers. The scheme is funded purely from donations from our clients and our drivers are paid 45p per mile for each journey. This amount is set down by HMRC and is standard to all Link Schemes and just covers the car's running costs. The problem we are experiencing at the moment is that there is a considerable shortfall between the amount received in donations and the amount paid in expenses to our drivers.

Last year we carried out the following journeys:- G W Hospital 82, Savernake hospital 78, other hospitals 17, Ramsbury surgery 170, Lambourn surgery 30, other health appointments 51 and non health journeys 86. So you can see that Link provides a great service to our villages.

Typical journey costs are as follows:- Ramsbury Surgery £5, Lambourn Surgery £6, GWH Hospital £8, Savernake Hospital and trips to Marlborough or Hungerford Dentists / Opticians etc £9

Appointments in Devizes £23 and Oxford Hospitals or Salisbury General Hospital £35.

We would be most grateful if clients would bear these figures in mind when making their donations. They are a fraction of a taxi fare.

Our aim is to keep this excellent scheme running for the benefit of the community, you never know when you might need it!

As the Scene goes to press, Baydon Flyer Niall Cooling is riding the Transcontinental Bike Race. The race started Geraardsbergen, Belgium, on the evening of 29th Jul. The riders set off up the infamous Muur, a steep cobbled climb that has gained legendary status in cycling (and a climb that has already been ridden by a group of the Baydon Flyers in a previous year).

We carried out an announced comprehensive inspection at Ramsbury & Wanborough Surgery on 10 May 2018. as part of our inspection programme.

At this inspection we found:

- The practice had clear systems to manage risk so that safety incidents were less likely to happen. When incidents did happen, the practice learned from them and improved their processes. Learnings from incidents were also shared with the wider locality and improvements implemented across the locality.
- The practice routinely reviewed the effectiveness and appropriateness of the care it provided at all levels and it ensured that care and treatment was delivered according to evidence- based guidelines.
- Patient outcomes were continually improving with the introduction of innovative programmes of care.
- Staff involved and treated patients with compassion, kindness, dignity and respect. Patient feedback was consistently, positive across all aspects of care.
- Patients found the appointment system easy to use and reported that they could access care when they needed it.
- Routine appointments were available within a few days of requesting one.
- There was a strong focus on continuous learning and improvement at all levels of the organisation.

We saw several areas of outstanding practice:

 Significant events were shared with the wider locality in order that sustained improvements in safety were implemented for the benefit of all patients in the area. This had been effective when an error was made in the dosage of a blood thinning medicine following blood testing by the community team. It was recognised that practices in the locality were all following different procedures. The practice took the opportunity to raise this with five other practices at a locality meeting. To minimise the risk of re-occurrence the practice led on introducing, a standard proforma which all practices in the locality were now using.

Review

Not That Kind of Love Clare and Greg Wise

Clare got sick, and her brother, Greg, nursed her closely towards the end, moving in to her home, even though he and his family had their own house close by. This book begins with Clare's blog, started to keep friends and family up-to-date as she went through diagnosis of and treatment for breast cancer. Greg took it over when secondary bone cancer attacked Clare after a time of

remission, and Clare became too ill to keep writing. (Just in case anyone were doubting: cancer is a pernicious evil which steals and kills and destroys and, of course, doesn't affect only the patient). Apart from plain reporting of events, the pair start to reflect on what is important in life, what really matters.

There is so much love, commitment and understanding (and learning to understand) laid bare in this book. To be there for someone, for that someone to be able to rely on you – that's precious. Would that everyone had someone like that; would that everyone – I – were someone like that.

On the journey, we learn things about the TV and film industry – not only that there are few rich superstars actually, but also that there are some gloriously warm and generous hearts in there. It turns out I have seen a film starring Greg Wise (*Sense and Sensibility*) but nowhere are his professional activities or the people he knows brought centre-stage – indeed, it was some time before I worked out who Em was. These are real-life, kind, down-to-earth, loyal people caring for one another in the face of catastrophic events. A touching, moving, challenging read; raw, thoughtful, sometimes funny; and rewarding.

Tamzin grew up in Baydon and comes back from time to time to visit her Dad. After some gadding about, she currently lives in the beautiful north east of England, working for a start-up exploiting a new X-ray imaging technique.

- The practice had initiated a scheme whereby the locality practices worked together to care for patients admitted to local nursing homes as an alternative to a hospital admission. Since its inception in 2015, 79 patients had been admitted to nursing home beds rather than hospital and only six of these had subsequently needed secondary care admission. Not only had this service reduced hospital admissions but patients were able to remain local to their family and support networks.
- The practice had implemented a range of initiatives to improve the management of long term conditions. Examples of this were the leg ulcer clinic, which had reduced onward referrals to the tissue viability service and healing times. One patient had been receiving treatment for 12 months prior to the initiation of the leg clinic. The ulcer was healed within six weeks of attending the leg clinic. The practice had taken part in the National Diabetes Audit which enabled the practice to benchmark themselves against other practices in the local clinical commissioning group and nationally. The practice had used these results to adapt and shape improved services for patients diagnosed with diabetes. The practice had recently received the most recent audit results which demonstrated significant improvements in the three target areas of patients living with Type 1 diabetes. Within the Wiltshire Clinical Commissioning Group (CCG) the practice had improved from 46th to 13th place. The practice was one of only two practices in the locality who had increased performance for patients living with Type 2 Diabetes.
